

**From the
Desk of
Fr. Dan**

Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill.

Jesus got in big trouble with the Jewish religious authorities because he seemed to ignore certain precepts of the Mosaic law – the law given to Moses by God. St. Matthew goes to great lengths to show that this is not true. Jesus is not ignoring God's law but man's interpretations of God's law.

Some laws are made by human beings to govern our relationships with one another – we call these "human law". Human law is subject to change, depending upon the needs of the people and the circumstances of daily life. The best example of this would be traffic laws. Traffic laws are made to keep travel both as safe and as convenient as possible. To be effective, these laws must change as technology and driving habits change.

Other laws are not subject to change because they are a part of what we call God's eternal law. These laws are always true and can never change because God and his truth never change. Although human laws may change depending on time, place, and culture, all peoples in all ages are called to observe God's eternal law. An example of eternal law would be the Ten Commandments. Not even the Pope can declare these commandments to be untrue or no longer applicable, because these are the laws that will govern the eternally just and peaceful society of heaven. This is the key to understanding why Jesus seemed to ignore certain laws in his day. He was trying to show the people the difference between eternal law and the human laws that were in place. He was purifying the human laws of his day so they corresponded more closely with God's eternal law. In our day, we must do the same. We should do our best to observe eternal law and to create a society where our human laws reflect it. We should elect lawmakers who will enact laws that correspond to eternal law and we should protest unjust laws that go against it. In doing so, we share in Jesus' mission to bring about the kingdom of heaven here on earth and prepare ourselves to observe God's law joyfully in heaven.

From the Pastor

POLICIES & PROCEDURES

This is a good time for me to repeat this basic "policy" as a Church and offer some reasons for it. As often as I publish some of these, there are still many times when people, out of touch with our faith for awhile, seem to be oblivious to the way we do things. Let me explain the role of a "Sponsor," because with Confirmations and Baptisms approaching, people are calling the office for "Sponsor Certificates." This role is, and always has been, considered a vital role in the life of individuals and the Church. We need one another's support. We need role models. We need to broaden the circle of communion with our lives as disciples of Jesus. So, for certain Sacraments, the Church asks us to obtain sponsors. Because it is both a privilege and responsibility within the life of the Church, she has every right to regulate the standards by which a sponsor is chosen.

In order for one to be sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, this person must be a Catholic who has completed his/her initiation (having celebrated Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist), and who has attained the age of 16 years. This seems basic enough, but you'd be surprised by the number of people who, never having celebrated Confirmation, expect that they can still be a sponsor. How can you help initiate someone when you haven't celebrated Confirmation? How can you help initiate someone when you haven't completed your own initiation? Then, there are the standard expectations: that a Catholic attend Mass regularly (every Sunday), be practicing the faith actively (witness with his/her life), if married, be in a valid (sacramental) marriage, and be registered in a parish where they live. These things are simply "standard practice" for a Catholic Christian. But, today, many believe they can be outside the bounds of the sacramental Life of the church while still celebrating these privileged roles. It just doesn't work that way. Our sacramental system links all of our faith practices together. There is no substitute for regular participation at Sunday Eucharist. And, while there are many ways to celebrate marriage, there is only one way for us to live this great gift as a sacrament. If you are asked to be a sponsor, but do not fulfill the requirements, consider the opportunity to put your sacramental Catholic faith back in action or back to order. These are not usually difficult things to do. Return to Sunday Mass; look into the celebration of your marriage as a sacrament; register in a parish.

As I often say when teaching about the role of sponsor, try to join any organization. We respect their rules for entry and their rules and regulations. Otherwise, why would we want to join the organization? Most expect us to enter with the support of a sponsoring member in good standing. Yet, when it comes to Church life, we expect the Church to bend its expectations to fit our lives. A number of people tell me they can't find someone in their family or circle of friends who fits the role of sponsor as described by the Church. This is a very real problem for us. But one that is easily enough rectified.

Tuesday, February 14 is the memorial of SS. Cyril and Methodius.

Cyril and Methodius were brothers. Born in Thessalonika, Greece, they were sons of a Senator. As young men, both held important posts. Cyril taught

philosophy at the University of Constantinople. Methodius was a Governor. But both felt hunger for a life of prayer, so they retired to a monastery. Soon afterward, they were asked to bring the Christian faith to the Khazars, a tribe of people in what is now southern Russia. Before beginning their missions, the brothers learned the Khazar language. Their hard work and study helped them to bring many people to Christianity. Then they traveled west to Moravia (now in the Czech Republic.) Again their ability to speak the native language, Slavonic, helped them to win many new Christians. Up to this time, Slavonic had no written characters, so nothing could be recorded in that language. Cyril and Methodius used Greek letters to invent an alphabet for the Slavic people. (The "Cyrillic" alphabet, a later version of the invention, is still used in Russia and several other countries.) Now the people could write down their stories and poetry for the first time. Cyril and Methodius began to translate the Bible and Liturgical books into Slavonic. The brothers traveled to Rome because they were having trouble with certain Bishops who complained about the use of the "barbaric" Slavonic language. However, the Pope blessed the work of Cyril and Methodius. During their stay in Rome, Cyril died. Methodius was made a Bishop and was sent back to Moravia, which became his Diocese. Unfortunately, out of spite, the hostile Bishops imprisoned him for two years. He used that time to continue the translation of Scripture that he and Cyril had begun. He died a few years later.
