

The Diocese of Greensburg requires all volunteers who are in contact with minors to have certain clearances on file at their parish. Because our parishes are family-oriented and we would never turn a child away from an event, this means that all of our volunteers, whether it's for liturgies or fish fries, festivals or bingos, are expected to have clearances on file.

No one I know likes clearances. No one likes to do annoying paperwork that gets in the way of helping out at church. It's particularly frustrating when it seems like my church is calling into question my character by having me do a background check. It's worth noting that the church is not asking you to do anything more in this regard than the state does. Anyone in the state of Pennsylvania who works with children, whether it's Little League or Scouts, is to have these clearances – not just Catholics. However, the Catholic Church does ask us to do more than the state does. We are not just asked to complete background checks but to create a safe environment for children.

Pedophilia is a mental illness and, like all mental illnesses, it is something that you cannot change about yourself. When treating mental illness, one of the greatest things you can do is create a healthy environment for the person that makes it easier not to act out. So, imagine that someone with the mental illness of pedophilia comes to a parish event. After all, we cannot identify and bar people who struggle with this illness from Mass or church activities. However, if everyone present is aware of the warning signs of pedophilia and trained in how to report it to the authorities, the chances of anything actually occurring would be extremely small.

This is why the Church asks for clearances from all volunteers. We cannot vet out everyone who will ever attempt to harm a child. However, we can create an environment where the possibility of something happening unnoticed and unreported would be practically impossible. By allowing yourselves to be trained in knowing the warning signs of pedophilia and learning how to report it to authorities, you are helping to create the safest place possible for our children.

There are six clearances required. All of these can be completed online. However, for those for whom the online task is a burden, on Friday morning you can have four of these taken care of in-person in just 10 minutes and on Saturday morning at the Virtus training you can complete a fifth in a couple of hours. Take advantage of the opportunity, get your clearances updated, and help us create a healthy environment for all of God's children.





## Liturgical Corner

An explanation of what we mean when we pray in the Creed, "We believe in the communion of saints." The Communion of Saints is a

doctrine that was included in the Apostles Creed which was readily used sometime around the year 100. This doctrine is based on St. Paul's First letter to the Corinthians. In Chapter 12, St. Paul compares Christians to a single body in which each member contributes to the good of all and shares in the welfare of all. "For as with the human body which is a unity although it has many parts - all the parts of the body, though many, still making up one single body - so it is with Christ." (v12) When St. Paul used the word saints in his writing, he was speaking of believers in Christ, both living and dead. Remember, that through our Baptism, we pass "from death to life; death no longer has dominion over us." When our earthly body dies, we pass into eternal life. In Catholic terminology, the Communion of Saints is said to comprise the Church Militant (those of us who are alive on earth), the Church Penitent (those undergoing purification in Purgatory in preparation for heaven), and the Church Triumphant (those already in heaven). The damned are not among the Communion of Saints. What is most beautiful about this doctrine is the belief that those who are in heaven (Church Triumphant) are in the presence of God. They constantly intercede with the Father for us. We think nothing about asking our close friends and relatives to pray for us. The saints in heaven are our friends and relatives as well. They are part of the body of Christ whose prayers help us here on earth. St. Dominic said, "Do not weep, for I shall be more useful to you after my death and I shall help you then more effectively than during my life." The Church also encourages us to imitate the holiness of the saints because they imitated the holiness of Christ. First among the saints is our Blessed Mother, Mary Queen of Heaven. She is a quintessential model for us all and never ceases to intercede on our behalf with her Son.

Many Catholics who are not active in the church will still seek out ashes on Ash Wednesday.


Likewise, many Jews who are not otherwise observant will follow the Day of Atonement, Yom Kippur with great exactness. People

customarily dress in white as a symbol of purity and a reminder of God's promise that our sins will be made white as snow. While the overture to Ash Wednesday for Christians may be a festive Mardi Gras celebration, for Jews it is the New Year feast of Rosh Hashanah. Then days before the Day of Atonement to God, people are expected to repair breaks in human life. These are days for offering forgiveness and seeking to repair harmed relationships. Everyone is expected to seek out someone and "clear the air" by asking for understanding for any mean words or thoughtless deeds in the past year. Perhaps the ashes you receive on Wednesday, February 22 will have a deeper meaning if you follow a similar plan. A conversation with some Jewish friends about their experience of a season of repentance may be a blessing on your Lent.

**This Saturday, February 11, is the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes**

On February 11, 1858, 14-year old Bernadette Soubirous was gathering wood with two other girls at a small rock cave, near the town of Lourdes, in the Pyrenees Mountains of southern France. Suddenly, she saw what she described “as a girl in white, no taller than I, and beautiful.” The young woman spoke to Bernadette in the dialect used in her little village. She addressed Bernadette with great courtesy. This made a tremendous impression on Bernadette, who was a below-average student and the daughter of poor parents. She was not used to being treated with such respect. Bernadette saw the vision 18 times. When she asked the woman who she was, she responded, “I am the Immaculate Conception,” using a term Bernadette had never heard. During one of the later appearances the woman in the vision told Bernadette to dig for water with her hands. When the girl did so, she uncovered a spring. The spring still flows, at the rate of 27,000 gallons daily. Many people have come to Lourdes in the years since the appearances to bathe in the spring and to pray for healing from all kinds of diseases. Bernadette never wanted the fame that the appearances brought her. She retired to a convent where she spent her days living as simply and humbly as possible. She was very ill throughout her short life, and she died in 1879 at the age of 35. She was declared a saint in 1933.
