



"What have you done for me From the lately"? I remember these lyrics from a popular 80's song by Janet Jackson. The lyrics of the song are a lamentation of a wife whose husband used to treat her well, but

now basically ignores her. She wonders why the relationship has changed so drastically and why his love seems to have slackened.

I think of this when I look at how the Israelites treat God in the book of Exodus. Just after the Lord leads Israel out of slavery in Egypt, allowing them to cross the Red Sea on dry land and destroying the Egyptian army in the process, the people sing a hymn of praise and triumph to God. Then we're told,

After traveling for three days through the wilderness without finding water...the people grumbled against Moses, saying, "What are we to drink?"

Of course, God comes through for them and provides them water. Just a month later, when they have no food to eat, they say this:

If only we had died at the Lord's hand in the land of Egypt, as we sat by our kettles of meat and ate our fill of bread! But you have led us into this wilderness to make this whole assembly die of famine!

Again, God provides them food – manna in the morning and quail in the evening. This becomes a recurring theme in Exodus. Almost immediately after God miraculously responds to the needs of the Israelites, they are complaining about something else. They are basically saying, "Yeah, Lord, you did some wonderful things for us, but that was last week. What have you done for me lately?" We can be just as fickle as the Israelites. When we are in need and God doesn't seem to be answering, we can forget just how much He has taken care of us to this point. We are often tempted to ignore the wonders of the past and focus on what we need here and now, even when that is shortsighted. We forget that God loves us in every moment, not just in past moments. His love never slackens for us and He has proven throughout history that He will answer when we need Him. We simply need to trust and wait for Him to answer.

#### Jesus as Teacher The Highest Qualifications

It is great to learn from a master. Whether it be carpentry or cooking, piano playing or business administration, there is nothing like learning from someone with a good background of experience. Such people have gained practical wisdom. They have learned what works and what doesn't work. Jesus was often called "Master." Living what He taught, He had high qualifications. Evidently, this was obvious to people, because they flocked out to hear Him. The disciples, Jesus' inner group, gradually came to realize that Jesus' qualifications went even beyond practical wisdom. One time He asked them, "Who do people say that I am?" Peter answered: "You are the Christ." Jesus was a supreme teacher, because His knowledge came directly from the One who set our lives in order. We all have the privilege of learning from the very best. We learn by both listening and doing. We are present-day disciples. The old values we found in fishing or in any day-to-day activity are not the sum total of our life possibilities. They are essential to keeping body and soul together, but each of us has inner spiritual potential that can enrich both our own lives and the life of the world around us. We learn from our Master Teacher in two ways. The scriptural account of Jesus' life and teaching helps us to understand what is of highest worth. For example, He draws a contrast between the arrogant show of rich men, who put large gifts into the temple treasury, and the heartfelt generosity of a poor widow, who gave only a couple copper coins. Jesus saw in her gift a greater value than all the others put together. Jesus revealed life's highest values. When we are open to it, we also learn by having Jesus' living presence within us. The resurrection is a continuing, every-day event, as we sense Christ's Spirit as a guiding presence within.

#### LENTEN GUIDELINES

**ABSTINENCE:** Catholics in the U.S. age 14 and older are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. The Church law forbids use of meat, but does not prohibit eggs, milk products or condiments made with animal fat.

**PRAY/ALMSGIVING:** Abstinence and fasting should lead Catholics to a deeper prayer life. Almsgiving provides an opportunity for a deeper understanding and response to the needs of the poor.
