

Desk of  
Fr. Dan*

One of the pieces of advice usually given during seminary is to wait at least a year after arriving to make significant changes in a parish. This is because it takes time to learn how things have been done and why. It's very easy to think that I know what we should be doing as a community, but without any history or context those thoughts can be misplaced. Unfortunately, Fr. Paul and I haven't had the luxury of waiting to act. When we arrived it was after the pandemic period when many parish activities either did not happen or were modified significantly. We simply could not wait a year to do anything new. In light of this, we have been very busy over the last 14 months. We trained new altar servers, lectors, extraordinary ministers of communion, sacristans, and ushers. We updated staff to respond to our shifting needs. We returned to enjoying many activities that had gone fallow, including parish festivals and other social activities. We updated many people's child abuse clearances and other policies according to diocesan expectations. We established a Walking with Moms group and a Young Disciples group and brought Pathways into our parish. We reopened the grotto at Visitation for Triduum and removed the old house on the lot across from St. Pius X. We did not and could not do these things alone. I thank you all deeply for your efforts and cooperation over the last year. We have many other ideas in store for the upcoming year. I'm hopeful to establish a youth group for grades 9-12, return to offering Children's Liturgy of the Word, and expand our Eucharistic adoration in light of our national Eucharistic Revival among other things. We are asking that you help us to continue our efforts to make our parishes as vibrant as possible. If you believe in what we are doing, please help to continue make it happen. Through your sacrifices of time, talent, and treasure, you will help us to continue these efforts and many others into 2023 and beyond.

## LENTEN GUIDELINES

**ABSTINENCE:** Catholics in the U.S. age 14 and older are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. The Church law forbids use of meat, but does not prohibit eggs, milk products or condiments made with animal fat.

**FASTING:** Catholics in the U.S., from the day after their 18th birthday until the day after their 59th birthday, are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Church law allows for only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit the taking of some food in the morning and evening. The combined quantity of the two meals should not exceed the quantity eaten at the full meal. The drinking of ordinary liquids does not break the fast. Note: Persons taking medication or with health concerns should follow their doctor's advice.

**PRAY/ALMSGIVING:** Abstinence and fasting should lead Catholics to a deeper prayer life. Almsgiving provides an opportunity for a deeper understanding and response to the needs of the poor.



**We are minded constantly of journeys during this Lenten Season.** Hopefully we are still active on our own

journey of Lent. Two groups of Christians are particularly important during Lent. First, there are the catechumens who have been chosen to be baptized this coming Easter. During Lent they make their final preparations. Second, there are baptized people who are in some way returning to the church. During Lent we try to join in praying for these people and for all of us. Every Lent we come back to our baptism. We struggle with the hard questions we were asked: Do you reject Satan? Do you believe in God? Do you believe in the church? We stand alongside the people who are soon to be baptized. With them, we look into that frightening water. In the sixth chapter of the Letter to the Romans, St. Paul tells us that we die in the water of baptism! We die in the hope that we will be raised with Christ. At baptism, Christians take on three lifelong disciplines. These are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. They help us remain faithful to our baptismal promises. Each of these disciplines can take many forms. Prayer is communication with God. Fasting is self-denial, self-control, simple living. Almsgiving is giving to those in need. We share our goods, our money, our talents and time. These three disciplines function best when they are done together. They balance each other. The word itself, "discipline," reminds us that we are "disciples" of Christ. Another word for prayer, fasting and almsgiving is "exercise." Exercise does little good unless it's done according to a schedule that we stick to. If we make excuses not to exercise, if we cheat on the program, then we won't get results. The same can be said for prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Lent is the season to renew good ways to practice these three kinds of activity. Most Christians find that, in time, these three exercises transform their way of life. This is the season to give the earth and ourselves a spring cleaning. This is the season to turn away from our wanderings and to travel home to God. How are we doing 1 1/2 weeks into our Lenten journey.

**The Mount Pleasant ministerium will return to hosting a series of Lenten lunches, through March 29, on the Wednesdays of Lent.** The luncheon begins at noon and will conclude at 1pm. The afternoon will include a reflection by one of the clergy from the area and a light lunch will be served. There is no charge for this meal. All lunches will be held at Mt. Pleasant Church of God at 936 W. Main Street. All are invited to attend for a time of fellowship and reflection during this season of Lent.

### **Jesus as Teacher Achieving our Life Purpose**

It is a matter of purpose! The purpose of a plant is to grow and produce. If it stops growing, it begins to die. If it does not produce a blossom or fruit, something is wrong in the plant itself or in its surroundings, like lack of water or poor soil. Human life, too, finds purpose through growing and producing. In our early years we grow physically and psychologically. In later years, as maturity is reached, the growth is found in spirit and understanding, emphasizing quality more than quantity. Youth is beautiful to look at. Mature life can reveal inner beauty, perhaps not seen as quickly but of precious value. How do we produce this kind of beauty? Jesus' parable of the soils, in the fourth chapter of Mark, comments on the growth of plants, but he interprets it as growing the person, the human spirit. He pictures four conditions that help or hinder growth. Plants never get a start if birds come by and eat the seeds. Sometimes, people never have a chance to discover a real purpose in their lives. A second group of plants gets a start, but they are on rocky soil and soon die from malnutrition. People, who are superficial and have no roots, no deep convictions, may grow apathetic and lose their spirit. Of plants that do get a good start, some do the best they can but are choked out by weeds. So many things lure us away from our core purpose in life, offering no lasting satisfaction. But there are those who succeed. The plants sown in good soil are like people, who respond fully to the gifts life offers us. They sense life's real purpose. They grow and produce - produce lives that reflect the image of their Creator. This parable asks us to consider the way we receive the message of faith and respond to it. However good our seed may be, purposeful life calls for being open to spiritual growth and seeking to produce a life of meaning and fulfillment.
