

Now that Lent and Triduum *From the* have come and gone, it's time to start looking ahead. We have a lot of things coming up that I would like to share, especially for our young people and young families.

In May, we are training new altar servers. I am hopeful that our Masses have been meaningful for our children and teens and that they will want to participate in them more. Being an altar server is a wonderful way to learn more about our liturgies and our faith and to serve the community. Physically being in the sanctuary during Mass is much more engaging than being in the pew. Our existing servers seem to enjoy it and I am always excited to let them do more and more as they grow into that role. Please see the bulletin announcement for details and contact the office if you or your child is interested in serving.

In the fall, we are planning to bring back the Children's Liturgy of the Word to the 10:30 AM Mass. It's a great service to children K-5 so they can hear God's word at their own level and a great service to parents so they can have a few minutes nourishing their own faith at Mass without needing to worry about their kids. We are looking for 8 volunteers – 4 teachers and 4 helpers – to help once a month. Please contact Linda at the office if you are interested in helping with this starting in September. Finally, we hope to start a youth group for high-schoolers in the fall as well. For it to be successful, it needs to give them what they truly want and need from Church. So first, we need to get to know them better and spend time with them. So, starting in May, we will be hosting some monthly social gatherings for our high schoolers until the school year starts in the fall. The first one will be on Sunday, May 7 from 1-3 PM. We'll play sports and games and just have a good time together. It's important that Church is not exclusively about learning and prayer. It can and should also be about being with each other and getting to know other faithful people better. I can commit to you that I will do my part to make Church more engaging, attractive, and inspiring for everyone, both young and old. Our faith is something we will carry with us for the rest of their lives and into eternity and it needs to be a priority for people of every age. I ask you to do your part in attending events and activities of our parishes. In a particular way, I ask parents of children to help them to be involved and connected with their faith. Many days it's hard to get them out the door, but one day they will thank you for giving them the gift of faith and Church.



Hospital/Nursing Home Stays:

A recently enacted federal law has affected the long-standing practice of hospitals and nursing facilities to provide information to churches about parishioners who are patients/residents. Because of that new law, the priests and the staff in the parish office may not promptly learn, or may not learn at all, that a member of the parish has been admitted to a hospital or nursing facility. If you, or a member of your family, are hospitalized to either a long-term care facility or assisted, independent living or residential facility, please personally contact the office promptly and identify the patient/resident, the hospital or nursing facility and the room number. Because all area hospitals or nursing facilities may not have the same policies allowing the priest of the parish to know when members are patients/residents, direct notice to the parish from you or your family is a better approach. If the parish office does not receive word, the priest will do his best to obtain information about parishioners, but hospitals and nursing facilities are limited in their opportunity to give out information.

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is Good Shepherd Sunday

Psalm 23 begins, "The Lord is my shepherd." This psalm is much loved, especially by people who are grieving or in trouble. Most people have never met a shepherd, and they rarely see sheep. And yet the image of God as our shepherd is strong and lasting. Springtime is the season lambs are born and grow strong. Perhaps that is why every Easter season brings us a renewed acquaintance with our Good Shepherd. The communion song for the Fourth Sunday of Easter gets right to the point: "The Good Shepherd is risen, alleluia!" The prophet Ezekiel said that bad shepherds let wolves catch the sheep. Jesus said that he is the good shepherd who lays down his life for the sheep.

This Monday, May 1, is the Feast of Saint Joseph, the Worker

The liturgical celebration in honor of St. Joseph the Worker dates back to 1955 when it was established by Pope Pius XII, and first was celebrated the following year. Workers have long celebrated May 1st as May Day in honor of labor and as a symbol of their rights. It was the intention of Pius XII to give a Christian dimension to this day, and to teach the dignity of human labor, with St. Joseph as a model for the laborer. Appropriately, in the Opening Prayer we note that God call all of us "to develop and use (our) gifts for the good of others" and with St. Joseph as our example and guide, we ask that God help us to do what is His will for us. Joseph's role was that of protector and provider. God's "wise and loyal servant," for Mary and Jesus. Joseph was selfishly obedient to God, humble and quiet and perseveringly faithful. We will be blessed if we use our particular talents and energies and opportunities for God. We will enjoy what we accomplish and grow in our love of God and our gratitude to Him.
