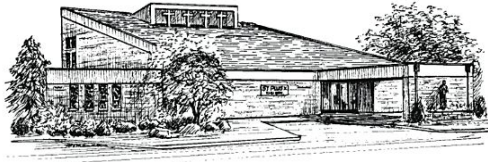

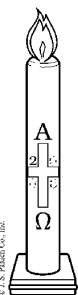

## **Christus vivit! Christ is alive! Alleluia!**

For much of human history, people have speculated about the nature of the universe and whether it will come to an end somehow. The majority of modern-day physicists believe in what is commonly called the “heat-death” theory. The idea is that the universe only has so much energy and that energy gets used up over time. Our modern forms of energy production come from borrowing energy that already exists, like energy from the sun, the energy from motion (water and wind), and energy stored within combustible materials (coal, gas). We cannot generate new energy, just harvest energy that already exists. And eventually, that energy will run out. Everything that moves is slowly grinding to a halt.

This means that our universe is slowly dying. No advances in science can save us. If the earth enters a new ice age, we can figure out a way to survive. If our sun dies, we can find somewhere else to live. But if the universe runs out of energy, we are completely helpless. There is nothing we can do about it. Eventually, all life will end in death. Death is going to win.

But when Jesus came, he didn’t come to just be the foretold Messiah. He didn’t just come to save us from our sins. He didn’t even come just to conquer Satan and the forces of evil. He came to conquer death itself. This prompted St. Paul to announce to the world, “Death is swallowed up in victory! Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?” Thanks to Christ, who has power over death, death no longer has the last word. Although it seems like everything alive must end in death, this is not true. Life is stronger than death because of Christ’s sacrifice on the cross and resurrection from the dead.

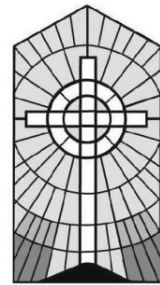
This is why Easter is so important. It is the celebration of life defeating death. Our death is the result of sin – the first sin of Adam and Eve as well as our own individual sins. Without Christ, this sin inevitably leads to death. With Christ, who offers us forgiveness of sins, life conquers even the death of our sins.

In 2019, Pope Francis wrote an apostolic exhortation called *Christus Vivit*. It begins like this:

*Christ is alive! He is our hope, and in a wonderful way he brings youth to our world, and everything he touches becomes young, new, full of life.*

Christ is alive! Death has been swallowed up in victory. No matter how strong death is, no matter how old and run-down the world seems to get, Christ has overcome it. Christ can bring newness and life into places that seem overcome by death and despair. Christ is stronger than the forces of death. Christ is alive! This is our Easter proclamation. Christ is risen as He promised. *Christus vivit!* Christ is alive! Alleluia!

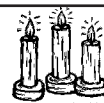
**Homebound Communion Visits**

If the parish office does not receive word, the priest will do his best to obtain information about parishioners, but hospitals and nursing facilities are limited in their opportunity to give out information.

## Listening with the ear of the heart

Again and again Jesus (and his Father before him) complained that God's people don't listen. We hear but we don't. We have trouble listening - to God, to each other, to our own hearts. We are tired, distracted, preoccupied, and reluctant to listen to truths that challenge us. For Christians, the key to listening is opening our hearts and minds to the love of God present to us in the Word. If we want to learn to listen, we need to pray. Consider developing our spiritual listening skills this Easter through the ancient prayer practice of *lectio divina*. This is a way of meditating on sacred texts.

For *lectio* you will need:

- ◆ a place to pray that is private and quiet.
- ◆ a time set aside for prayer
- ◆ the cooperation of the people with whom you live
- ◆ a good reading light
- ◆ a sacred text
- ◆ commitment

Make a commitment to read a little each day, asking God's assistance before you begin. Many of us have learned to process the massive quantities of information that assault us daily by merely scanning, not truly reading. While useful on the job or in class, scanning can be a hindrance to prayerful reading of the scripture. Try reading the scriptures out loud. Verbalizing the text is an ancient practice that can help us slow down and listen, as St. Benedict says, "with the ear of the heart."

## Who is considered a parishioner?

We are often asked how we define who is a parishioner of one of our parishes. A parishioner is:

- ◆ baptized Catholic
- ◆ registered member of one of our parishes
- ◆ participates in the faith community of our parishes by regular attendance of Mass here

If you are currently registered with your parents but are 18 or older, independent and employed (not a student), you should register individually as a parishioner. Those who are not registered and who do not actively participate in the parish faith community are not considered members. Baptism at one of our parishes, or any other parish, does not mean you are automatically considered a lifelong member.

## Jesus as Teacher Commencement

The weeks leading up to Easter were like those before a school graduation, full of hope but also full of trepidation. Jesus and His disciples had gone through so much. The excitement of Palm Sunday was invigorating, but Good Friday brought an end to all hope. Had the disciples made a big mistake, seeking a new kingdom but finding that they had lost and evil had won? Easter morning answered this question with a great big "No!" It was not a mistake, because Jesus is the eternal "Yes!" It is all worth the struggle. James Russell Lowell captures the picture in writing words for the hymn, "Once to Every Man and Nation."

Tough the cause of evil prosper,  
Yet 'tis truth alone is strong,  
Truth forever on the scaffold,  
Wrong forever on the throne.  
Yet, that scaffold sways the future,  
And behind the dim unknown,  
Standeth God within the shadow  
Keeping watch above His own.

Easter does not eliminate Lent. Neither do God's promises mean life will be easy, but we do come to realize that life is still worth living. In school, studying does bring knowledge. Careful experimentation brings failures but also rewards. Diligence pays off. God is with us through all of it, and when we respond faithfully the diploma is finally in our hands. Jesus teaches us never to despair and give up. The "down" days, the times of discouragement, times when it seems that our life has little value are part of the curriculum of life. God helps us to endure, restores our vision and renews our hope. Easter is here! Christ is risen! Your life and the world's life lead to commencement. It is now time to take what we have learned and move on with strength and understanding to achieve new goals.
