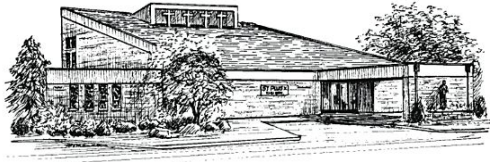

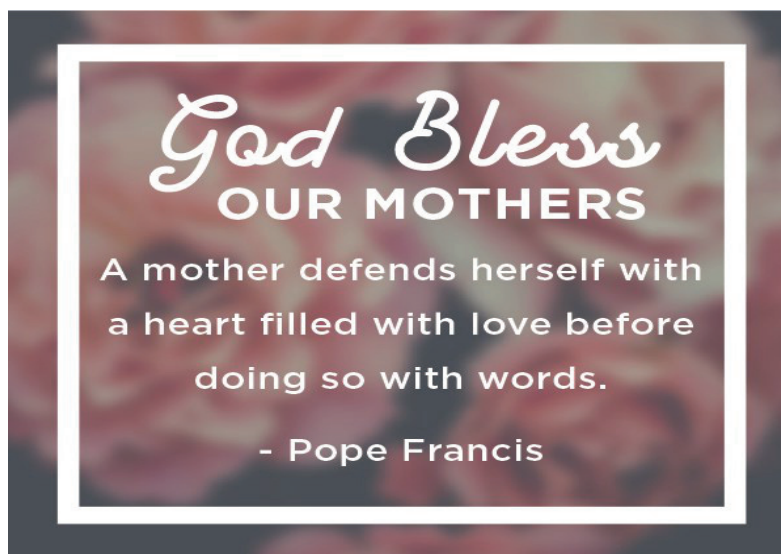

From the Desk of Fr. Dan

Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence, keeping your conscience clear. – 1 Pt 3:15
Apologetics is a discipline in theology that focuses on defending the precepts of the faith. My article last week about Mary’s perpetual virginity was apologetic in nature. This is an important discipline that finds its roots in St. Peter’s letter. *Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope.*

I think many of us can struggle to do that. We often know what we believe but not why. We can offer a formula but not an explanation. Apologetics can help with this. Getting a more detailed explanation to why the Church believes what she believes and how our doctrine developed to what it is over the course of human history can help us increase our faith and understanding of God’s revelation. Learning these explanations and reasons for our beliefs strengthens what we have and also helps us to share our faith more eloquently and in a more attractive way.

There are all kinds of apologists out there on the internet. What can be sometimes troubling to me about some apologists is the way they go about it. They are strong in what they believe, but their conviction can at times be very off-putting. They come across as arrogant or stuffy, unwilling to listen to others. They forget that St. Peter gives an additional admonition about how to give an explanation: *with gentleness and reverence*. There is a gentleness in good apologetics that recognizes and respects the truth present in peoples’ ways of thinking. In some ways they might be mistaken. It might not be the whole truth. But most people don’t think something or have strong convictions without reasons. A good apologist can incorporate the good in mistaken points of view and thereby come to a deeper understanding of the fullness of truth.

One apologist I personally know, Joe Heschmeyer, does this very well. He is a friend of mine from seminary who runs a blog and podcast through Catholic Answers called “Shameless Popery”. He’s not a priest – he discerned out and got married. He is very intelligent and is an excellent apologist. I love listening to his podcasts because he does great research and presents things in a very reasonable and helpful way. He does not come across as arrogant, just as someone passionate about the truth and desirous to share it. When he presents arguments about which he disagrees, he is clear about what is wrong but gentle in pointing out why it’s attractive to many. I’ll warn you that his content can sometimes end up in the weeds of theology and might be headier than some would like, but I would recommend his podcast as a starting point to anyone who is seeking a better explanation of their faith.

The nine days from Ascension until Pentecost Pentecost Novena

The Ascension of the Lord is kept on the 40th day of the Easter season. The giving of the Spirit is celebrated at Pentecost, the 50th and final day of Eastertime. The nine days from Ascension to Pentecost are called the “novena,” which is the Latin word for the number nine. These final days of Eastertime are days of prayer for a new outpouring of the Spirit, a new Pentecost.

Rosary for Peace

Everyone is invited to St. Pius X Church every Wednesday @ 11:30am to pray the Rosary.



This Thursday, May 18th is the Feast of the Ascension, a Holy Day of Obligation commemorating Christ’s return to heaven under His own power forty days after His Resurrection.

It marks the close of the visible mission of Jesus on earth, the reappearance in heaven of His total humanity glorified, placed in the position of honor at His Father’s side eternally. It is from this seat of glory that He sent the Spirit of Pentecost and will come to the final general judgement of all people. Formerly, the paschal candle was extinguished at the end of the Gospel this day to symbolize His ascent. Now, it is lighted during baptisms and funerals to recall Christ’s death, Resurrection and Ascension and remains lighted at Masses until Pentecost Sunday. The throne of the Ascension is that Christ has passed beyond our sight, not to abandon us but to be our hope. He is the beginning, the Head of the Church; where He has gone, we hope to follow. Our hope is strong because Christ, although gone physically, has not left us spiritually. All Catholics are obliged to attend Mass on this day.
