Desk of Fr. Dan

I think it's incredible that the **From the** Easter season is longer than Lent. Lent always feels longer because of the sacrifices we make during that time. But Lent is only 40 days – Easter is 50 days. This Sunday is the

43th day of the Easter season – the Sunday between the Ascension (40<sup>th</sup> day) and Pentecost (50<sup>th</sup> day). Does it really feel like Easter happened all that long ago? Not to me. But I'm guessing it did for the apostles. What a whirlwind they went through. Jesus entered triumphantly into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday and within a week was shockingly killed. Three days later, his body is no longer in the tomb and he's appearing to all sorts of people everywhere. Jesus' appearances are rarely predictable (only one appearance is "foretold" in Matthew 28:10) and the disciples never seem ready for it. The Scriptural post -Resurrection stories (Mark 16; Matthew 28; Luke 24; John 20 and 21; and Acts 1), are mostly marked by confusion, hesitancy, and doubt. Imagine 40 days of that. When is Jesus going to show up this week? What will he do?

Eventually, Jesus tells them that he's going home to his Father on the Ascension and then he disappears. No more appearing acts. But...now what? Well, we hear what they do in today's first reading. They wait for the Holy Spirit to come from

When they entered the city [the apostles] went to the upper room where they were staying...[and] devoted themselves with one accord to prayer, together with some women, and Mary the mother of Jesus and his brothers.

I think there is a lesson in this. We all go through moments of our life that are marked by confusion, hesitancy, and doubt. How do we respond in these moments? The best thing to do is to go into our upper room and devote ourselves to prayer. Often this is not what we want to do. We want to distract ourselves and not think about our problems. We flit from thing to thing, trying to forget about it. We might even resort to drugs, alcohol, sex, and other coping mechanisms that only prolong the suffering. The best way out of our messes is to go into the upper room, talk to God, and wait for the Holy Spirit. It might not happen right away. It took 50 long days after the Resurrection for the Holy Spirit to come. That's a long time to be troubled. Yet, by turning to God instead of away from Him, we prepare ourselves to be ready to receive the Holy Spirit and shorten the time of suffering.

During these days leading up to Pentecost the Church prays "Come, Holy Spirit." No matter what's going on in our lives, may we take time to go into that upper room and invite the Holy Spirit to come and transform our lives.





According to Church Law, Trinity Sunday, June 4, is the last Sunday that vou can make your Easter duty. The confession of sin cleanses us. Christ in

communion is our strength. Please do not deprive yourself of such gifts of healing, strength and love. Just for clarification, the precept of the Church is as follows: To lead a sacramental life; to receive the Sacrament of Penance regularly and Holy Communion frequently minimally, at least once a year, between the first Sunday of Lent and Trinity Sunday.



## Do you know of someone who is interested in learning about the Catholic Church?

Are you drawn to the Catholic Church and would like to learn what Catholics believe? Are you someone who was baptized Catholic, but not fully initiated? (Did not receive the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation.) Each of us is on a journey to deepen our relationship with Jesus Christ. The <u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)</u> is the setting for individuals to learn what it means to be a Catholic Christian. This is an opportunity for you to discover what Catholics believe and discern if you are called to this journey of faith. Individuals from the parish walk with you, sharing their faith and allowing you to question and explore what it means to live as a Catholic Christian. We gather to pray, to read Scripture, to explore topics of our faith tradition and to support one another in this journey. As a first step, there will be inquiry sessions through the summer months; we usually meet a couple of times a month. It is a time to ask questions or have discussions about introductory information concerning the Catholic faith. Then in early September, we normally meet on a weekly basis. At that time we begin a deeper and more intense exploration of the faith. ## This Friday, May 26 is the Feast Day of St. Philip Neri, presbyter, religious founder (1515-1595)

As a young man Philip Neri came to Rome, where he went out to the squares,

shops and banks. There he challenged the other young men he met, asking them when they meant to begin doing good. Many of them, rich and poor alike, soon joined him. They volunteered in the hospitals of the city to care for patients. They did the dirtiest jobs. In the afternoon, they met with Philip for prayer, song and study at a place called the Oratory. Philip was good at guiding those who wanted to grow in their prayer. Pilgrims who came to Rome to visit its holy places attended his teachings in such great numbers that a large room had to be built to hold them all. People in trouble felt calmed just by being in the same room with him. People came to him for spiritual direction. Some of them also became famous saints, including Ignatius of Loyola, Francis de Sales and Camillus de Lellis. Yet Philip never took himself seriously. He wore old clothes and once shaved off half his beard just because people were saying how saintly he looked. When the pope wanted to honor Philip by appointing him a cardinal, the pope hung a cardinal's hat on Philip's door. A cardinal's hat is flat, so Philip tossed it in the air like a frisbee. One of the people Philip guided, Francis de Sales, said that "a sad saint would be a sorry saint." Philip's joy was convincing to so may people that he would come to be called the second apostle to Rome. By the time he died at age 80, the whole city had been transformed by the spirit of the Oratory.
