

From the Desk of Fr. Dan

Did Jesus have siblings? This is often a question posed to me about the Blessed Mother, whom we celebrate in this month of May. The Church believes and teaches that Mary was “ever-virgin”, that is, a virgin before, during, and after Christ’s birth. However, Scripture seems to contradict this. All four of the Gospel writers speak of Jesus’ brothers in various places.

Someone told him, “Your mother and your brothers are standing outside, asking to speak with you.” - Mt 12:47

The first recorded debate on this issue took place in the fourth century. The theologian, Helvidius, wrote that Scripture suggests that Mary had other children. *...and she gave birth to her **first-born** son.* - Lk 2:7 (implying that there would have been a second-born.)

St. Jerome staunchly defended the “perpetual virginity of the Blessed Mary” against Helvidius. He first argues that in Semitic language the terms “brother” and “sister” can also refer to cousins, or extended relatives, and that often the Old Testament translated the broader Hebrew term ‘*ah*’ into the more narrow Greek term *adelphos*. Thus, although the Greek language has a different word for cousin, there is Scriptural precedent to use *adelphos* in this way. The Catechism of the Catholic Church points this out:

#500: Against this doctrine the objection is sometimes raised that the Bible mentions brothers and sisters of Jesus. The Church has always understood these passages as not referring to other children of the Virgin Mary. In fact James and Joseph, “brothers of Jesus”, are the sons of another Mary, a disciple of Christ, whom St. Matthew significantly calls “the other Mary”. They are close relations of Jesus, according to an Old Testament expression.

Jerome then explains that first-born in Luke 2:7 does not necessarily imply a second-born. (“*The word of God defines first-born as everything that opens the womb.*”) I would also add that “first-born” carries a theological meaning, as Jesus is the “new Adam” for St. Paul. *For those he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, so that he might be the **first-born** among many brothers.* – Rom 8:29.

Jerome also raises a good point that, if Jesus had brothers and sisters, then He would not have commended Mary to the Beloved Disciple at the foot of the cross in John 19:26-27, as she would have had other children to care for her.

St. Jerome’s interpretations became a basis for the Church’s teaching about Mary’s perpetual virginity, which was officially stated for the first time in at the Second Council of Constantinople in 553 and has been held ever since. Is St. Jerome’s interpretation conclusive? Is the Church’s argument foolproof? No. But it is also not unreasonable to conclude that the Church, guided and inspired by the Holy Spirit, was led to the truth about Mary in the fourth century and has maintained the truth to this day.

What is a Votive Candle?

The act of lighting a candle when offering a special prayer has long been a cherished tradition. And, as a way to help advance the works of the Church and to offer a sacrifice to Christ, it has become customary to give an offering for the candle. Thus, the term *votive candle*. The word votive comes from the Latin verb *voveo*, meaning I desire. It signifies an offering in which a *gift is linked with a prayer intention as a sacrificial dedication of oneself to God, submission to His will and reliance on His mercy and providence*. Essentially, a votive candle is a sentinel that we leave burning heavenward at a sacred place as a visual sight of our prayer of thanks or request. We are fortunate votive candles are available at each of our churches. The donation for each candle is \$3.00.

A Note From Our Administrator

As was shared with the parish many times, through the bulletin and in conversation, please try to understand how care is given to our parishioners who are entering the hospital. If you will be going to the hospital for elective surgery, please contact Fr. Paul or Fr. Dan to receive the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Please do not wait until you arrive at the hospital to call a priest for the Sacrament; the priests visit patients and do provide pastoral care for our parishioners at our local hospitals when we are aware of our parishioners admittance. Also, family members should not wait until the last minute to call a priest to come and celebrate the sacraments. The sacrament called Anointing of the Sick is given to the sick and dying as part of the Church's comprehensive care of the person from sickness and dying to death and burial. If one of our parishioners is admitted to any other hospital, please let the nurse or the pastoral care office at that hospital know that you wish to be visited by a priest or to receive Holy Communion. Your priests are not able to visit every parishioner in every hospital. Every hospital does have an assigned Catholic chaplain for this reason. Because of new privacy rules, the patient or his/her family must make the effort to be listed as a Catholic on the hospital census and make it known to the staff there that they wish to be visited by clergy. Please do not take for granted that priests or Eucharistic Ministers have your name on a list.

If by chance you call the parish office and one of the priests are not available, please leave a message. If they do not return your phone call, please call again because the message may have been erased or misplaced by accident. Also, if you need a reply, please let us know when the best time is to return your call because sometimes we just leave a message or there is no voice mail available and we do not connect immediately.

Please know if there is an emergency at home or at the hospital and we receive a call, we come as soon as possible. But there are times when the priests from the area are just not available. Remember, at one point there were 18 priests serving this region and now there are only 7 priests. If you have any questions, please contact Fr. Paul or Fr. Dan. Thank you for your understanding.

Eye to Eye With Jesus

In the time between Easter and the Ascension, Jesus appeared to his disciples in the burial garden, in closed rooms, and by lake shores. It's tempting to view those stories as mere throwbacks to Scriptural times. It was easier for them, we tell ourselves; they actually saw Jesus himself. We often forget that more than once, the disciples failed to recognize Jesus until his actions revealed his divinity. Why was that? Were their minds clouded? Or is it possible that he wore a different face than the man they had known? Maybe, just maybe, it was difficult for them to recognize the face of Jesus as it is for us today. Modern life keeps us in motion and constantly stimulated. The irony is that with so much to see, we miss a lot. We avoid eye contact with people holding signs at street corners; we avoid eye contact with people who exhibit signs of disability or mental illness; we avoid eye contact with people going through tough times, because we don't know what to say or we don't want to get involved. Eye contact invites communication, and communication leads to relationships. However fleeting, we are, in that moment, responsible for honoring the dignity of another person. We are compelled to act, but we don't know how we can take on another burden when we're already so heavy-laden that we feel we're treading water. We're afraid the weight of one more thing will pull us under. Jesus Christ is still appearing in our world, every day, every moment. But if we do not consciously seek his face among those we encounter, we run the risk of not recognizing him at all.
