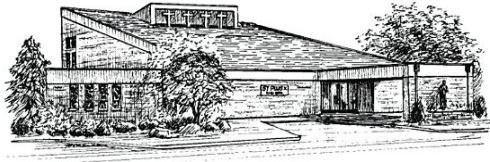

### The Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is Friday, June 16.

This feast is a reminder that we all owe our love to our Divine Redeemer. It is an appeal to our gratitude and it should prompt us to offer to

the Divine Heart satisfaction and reparation for the numerous offenses of which we and others have been guilty. Appearing to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, during the Octave of Corpus Christi in the year 1675, Jesus said to her: *"This is the heart which has loved men so much and in turn is so little loved by them."*

**From the Desk of Fr. Dan**

I don't believe everything that I read on the internet. I also don't believe every result of surveys and studies. That being said, a Pew survey done in 2019 showed that over half of Catholics do not believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Taking their cue from Protestant theology, they believe that the Eucharist is a symbolic reality.

I don't entirely trust the results of that commonly-cited survey. Many self-described Catholics are not active or practicing. Many others may have misunderstood the language being used in the survey because it was a secular study and what we believe is not common knowledge anymore. However, I am not surprised that the Eucharist is misunderstood. If it were understood better, Mass attendance would be more widespread. I believe that many of the difficulties in our Church today stem from this lack of understanding of and lack of devotion to the Eucharist.

The bishops of the United States seem to agree with me. In 2022, the USCCB announced a nationwide Eucharistic revival. This has prompted our diocese to host several Eucharistic events this calendar year and a Eucharistic Congress last month. Moreover, starting this Sunday, the feast of Corpus Christi, this revival moves to the level of our parishes. Fr. Paul and I are hopeful that during this upcoming year we can foster a greater devotion in our parishes to the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ and inspire those who struggle to believe, those who have left the Church, and those who have fallen away to be drawn back into the loving presence of our Lord.

I ask that you pray for the success of this revival in our parishes, in our diocese, and in our country.

**Prayer for Eucharistic Revival**

Lord Jesus, You are the living bread who satisfies the hunger of the human heart. In the Eucharist, the bread and wine become Your Body and Blood, the gift of Yourself to the Church. Deepen our faith in Your Eucharistic presence and strengthen us as members of the Church, the Body of Christ. As we encounter and revere Your Eucharistic presence, open us to the needs of our brothers and sisters here and everywhere throughout the world. Help us to reveal Your love, Your promise, Your presence to them by our lives and in all we say and do. Amen.

**Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ**



Today, in the Church, we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This feast is also known by its Latin name Corpus Christi. To recall the institution of the Eucharist on Holy Thursday, when sorrow over the Passion, the prime thought during Holy Week, hinders a proper celebration, this feast was established and is celebrated on the Thursday (or Sunday) after Trinity Sunday. It owes its origin to the progressive development of worship and devotion to the Blessed Eucharist during the Middle Ages and to a revelation to St. Juliana of Liege where it was first celebrated as a local feast. In 1264, it was extended to the Universal Church.

**Do you know of someone who is interested in learning about the Catholic Church?**

Are you drawn to the Catholic Church and would like to learn what Catholics believe? Are you someone who was baptized Catholic, but not fully initiated? (Did not receive the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation.) Each of us is on a journey to deepen our relationship with Jesus Christ. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the setting for individuals to learn what it means to be a Catholic Christian. This is an opportunity for you to discover what Catholics believe and discern if you are called to this journey of faith. Individuals from the parish walk with you, sharing their faith and allowing you to question and explore what it means to live as a Catholic Christian. We gather to pray, to read Scripture, to explore topics of our faith tradition and to support one another in this journey. As a first step, there will be inquiry sessions through the summer months; we usually meet a couple of times a month. It is a time to ask questions or have discussions about introductory information concerning the Catholic faith. Then in early September, we normally meet on a weekly basis. At that time we begin a deeper and more intense exploration of the faith. If you would like to speak with someone about the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), please call the parish office (724-547-1911) to speak with Fr. Dan Carr or Cindy Copeland.

If you are attending one of our parishes and are not a registered parishioner, we would like to invite you to do so. Simply call the parish office and we can get this done. You may also register if you are no longer a student and living with your parents or on your own. Do not assume that because your parents are registered that you are automatically registered as an adult. This is a necessity for being a godparent or confirmation sponsor. You are not permitted to be either if you are not an active, registered and practicing Catholic.





### Ordinary Time...

There are about 32 weeks outside the five church seasons. These weeks are called "Ordinary Time," from the word "ordinal," meaning "counted." Each week is given a number to help us divide the scriptures into readings and to place these in an orderly book called the

lectionary. We do the same thing with the Church's prayers at Mass, ordered day by day in a book called the Roman Missal. Ordinary Time is a name for the weeks that come between the church seasons. The period of Ordinary Time that lasts from Easter time until Advent spans over half the year. In the Northern Hemisphere, most of summer and autumn fall during these weeks. This is harvest time. In the gospels, Jesus often talked about the harvest as a symbol of what heaven might be like. Slowly but surely, as God's creatures grow ripe and then die, they will be harvested into heaven.

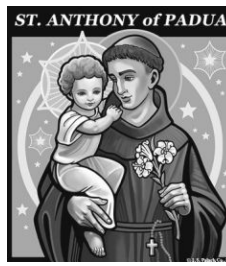

**This Tuesday, June 13, is the Feast Day of St. Anthony of Padua, presbyter, religious, doctor of the church.**

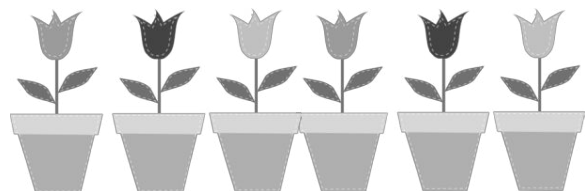
Anthony made such an impression on Padua in Italy that he is still admired there 700 years later. He is a much loved saint throughout the church.

Anthony was actually from Portugal, not Italy. His parents were nobles, and he could have chosen to live in luxury. But Anthony decided to devote his life to prayer and study. He became an Augustinian priest. He was a brilliant student who came to know the Bible inside and out. Ten years later Anthony learned about a new order, the Franciscans, who did missionary work. He wanted with all his heart to join them, and soon he was able to arrange it. Francis of Assisi, who had founded the Franciscans, was still alive. His spirit of poverty and love fired Anthony's heart.

Anthony traveled to Morocco to preach the Gospel. But severe illness sent him sailing for home. His ship blew off course and he landed in Italy instead. By chance, Francis had called the friars together there at this very time, so Anthony attended their meeting. Soon afterward the other friars heard Anthony preach. They realized he had a great gift. The wayward ship had steered him to what would become his life's work - preaching throughout Italy and France.

When Anthony preached, no Church could hold the crowds that came to hear him. He spoke in the marketplaces and town square. Because of what he said, parents and children made peace with each other. People gave back things they had stolen. People who had told lies admitted them publicly and corrected them. Maybe that is why Anthony is known as the patron saint of lost items. He worked to find lost people. His words were especially powerful because everyone knew that Anthony practiced what he preached. He was a humble person who chose to live in poverty. So many people experienced the love of God through his work that he became known as a "wonder worker."

Anthony spent the last three years of his life in Padua. He died when he was only 36 years old.
