

## To all parishioners of St. Pius X and Visitation Parishes

I am writing to inform you of the change in the Mass schedule for both of our parishes that will take effect beginning the first

weekend of July (July 1 and 2, 2023).

This request to change the Mass schedule was in consultation with Fr. Dan and our combined Parish Pastoral Council. Bishop Kulick accepted the recommendations and granted permission to change the Mass schedule of our parishes in Mt. Pleasant. The new Mass schedule which takes effect on the weekend of July 1st and 2nd, 2023 is as follows: Saturday Vigil Mass:

- 4:00pm at Visitation Church
- ♦ 6:00pm at St. Pius X Church Sunday Morning Mass:
- ♦ 8:30am at Visitation Church
- ◆ 10:30am at St. Pius X Church

Weekday Mass remains the same at 7:00am.

This Mass schedule, Fr. Dan and I believe, addresses the needs of our parishes in a very prayerful, sound and accommodating way in fulfilling our Pastoral and Liturgical needs.

Please realize that the 4:30pm Vigil Mass at Visitation will be moved forward to 4:00pm and confessions will be heard at 3:15pm. Also, the Sunday 8:00am Mass at St. Pius X will be eliminated and the 9:15am Mass at Visitation will be moved forward to 8:30am.

Our schedule for Holy Days will remain the same at the present time in addition to the rotation for holidays, the Easter Triduum and Christmas Masses. These schedules, as always, will be published in the bulletin.

The Mass intentions that are already assigned to the 8:00am Masses have been eliminated and will be combined with the Mass intention for the 10:30am Mass at St. Pius X on those Sundays.

Thank you for your understanding and your graciousness in accepting the Mass schedule change. I believe this will truly serve the needs of the parishioners of St. Pius X and Visitation Parishes.

## Father's Day

From the Desk of Fr. Dan

If you haven't read the announcement to the left of this column, I suggest that you do so first. It announces changes to the Mass schedule for our community – specifically the reduction of Masses

from 5 to 4. At all of the weekend Masses I gave two big reasons for this change – priest health and availability and a healthier spacing of our Mass times. I would like to add a few more here.

Reason 3: Fewer active families. The population in Westmoreland County went down by 3.3% between 2010 and 2020. The population of Mount Pleasant went down 4.9% in that same time. Combine this with the decline of religiosity in our nation and our number of active families has gone down by over 10% in both of our parishes in the last ten years. Needless to say, the number of Masses needed to provide the Eucharist in our community is going down, not up.

Reason 4: Canon Law. A priest is only supposed to say Mass once a day. However, if there is a priest shortage, a priest can celebrate a Mass twice a day and three times on Sundays or Holy Days of obligation. Technically, with the 5 Masses, I am not breaking canon law – 2 for Saturday, 3 for Sunday. But if there is a funeral, wedding Mass, ordination, or diocesan celebration involving Mass, I go against church law. I would prefer not to do this as often as I do.

Reason 5: Fuller Masses. Reducing the number of Masses will have the effect of ensuring more of the faithful are present at each Mass. In an ideal world, all people could be together at the same Mass every weekend like we hope to be with all the saints and angels in heaven one day. As impractical as this is, nothing is more depressing than an empty church at Mass. I've been greatly encouraged by our Mass attendance lately, but we've gotten to the point where the church "feels full" at 50% capacity. This shouldn't be the case. We should be needing to move into the middle of pews to make room for others. Reducing from five Masses to four means the church should be 25% more full at each Mass, leading to stronger responses, better singing, and a more joyful noise being made to the Lord. It's always a greater joy for me to celebrate Mass with more people and I hope it is for you too.

I am most grateful for your understanding in this matter and I look forward to being a bit more present and more available after Masses for your needs.

# Do you know of someone who is interested in learning about the Catholic Church?

Are you drawn to the Catholic Church and would like to learn what Catholics believe? Are you someone who was baptized Catholic, but not fully initiated? (Did not receive the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation.) Each of us is on a journey to deepen our relationship with Jesus Christ. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the setting for individuals to learn what it means to be a Catholic Christian. This is an opportunity for you to discover what Catholics believe and discern if you are called to this journey of faith. Individuals from the parish walk with you, sharing their faith and allowing you to question and explore what it means to live as a Catholic Christian. We gather to pray, to read Scripture, to explore topics of our faith tradition and to support one another in this journey. As a first step, there will be inquiry sessions through the summer months; we usually meet a couple of times a month. It is a time to ask questions or have discussions about introductory information concerning the Catholic faith. Then in early September, we normally meet on a weekly basis. At that time we begin a deeper and more intense exploration of the faith. # HAPPY FATHER'S DAY

Sonora Louise Smart Dodd of Spokane thought that her father, William Smart, had done a remarkable thing. A Veteran of the Civil War, he

had raised his six children alone on the family farm in Washington after his wife died in childbirth. When Miss Dodd suggested a day for fathers in 1909, she meant it to be a church service. Mother's Day, which had just come into wife practice, was originally a church service too. Public interest in establishing Father's Day was strong at once in both the United States and Canada. Father's Day became an official national day in 1966. What God Hath Done: God took the strength of the mighty oak, the steadfastness of the mountains tall, the warmth of the rising sun -He used them one and all. He took endurance from the hardy pine, love vast as the rolling sea, peace from the mountain stream, and the heart of the dogwood tree. He took from spring her promise, from summer the beauty of life, courage from the winter's struggle, and added faith to meet the strife. He took the soul of the twilight hour, the rich mellowness of the fall, the depth of the quiet lake, the mystery of the wild bird's call. A Father God Molded from these things to lead each home aright, down the path the Savior trod, out of darkness into light. Whether our fathers are with us or with God, we remember them today with deepest love and devotions. To all fathers of our parishes, Fr. # The Birth of John the Baptist: Midsummer Day, June 24

During the great cycle of the Christian year, there are three festivals in celebration of a person's birth. We celebrate the births of John the Baptist, of Mary, and of Jesus. These are the holy ones who were filled with the Spirit even before their birth. Keep in mind that, in Liturgy of the Church, a "nativity" is not a birthday. Birthdays are anniversaries of a birth. Instead, a nativity is the birth itself. Today is not John the Baptist's birthday. Today John is born. That's what we sing in the Liturgy today. Rejoicing at John's birth is a commandment of the Gospel. Even the angel Gabriel tells us to rejoice. The Gospel of John records that Jesus himself praises John the Baptist. The feast of John's birth was established very early in the Church's history, at about the same time as the feast of Christmas. Luke tells us that the angel Gabriel announced the conception of Jesus six months after announcing the conception of John. So the date of this feast is six months before Christmas.


