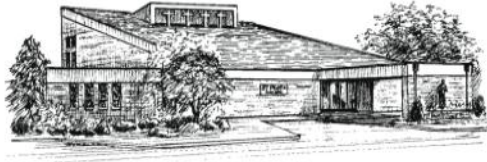

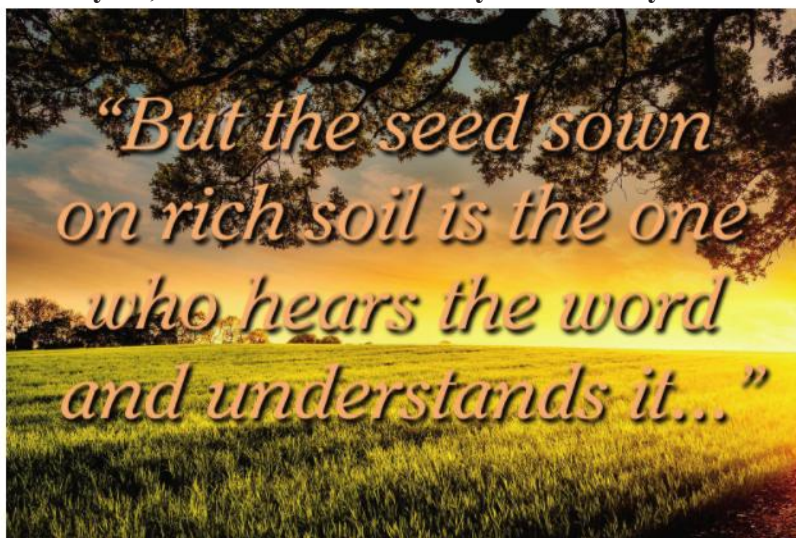

From the Desk of Fr. Dan

When I made the announcement that our Mass schedule would be changed, I mentioned that it was done “in consultation with pastoral council” (also known as parish council). This prompted a number of people to ask me, “Who’s on pastoral council?” I’m very glad that you asked me. Because these individuals represent you all, you should know who is on pastoral council. Their names are listed below along with their parish.

I believe in the past that you have been asked to vote for members of parish council. This is not the normal way members are selected – normally the pastor asks someone to be on council. Pastoral council members are to be selected “in such a way that they truly reflect the entire portion of the people of God.” Father Paul and I have attempted to choose members evenly from both parishes to do that very thing – something a vote would not be able to do. We have also attempted to choose a diversity of individuals who will be forthright with us – having a council of “yes people” does no one any good at all.

Parish council is an excellent place to bring forth ideas to the priest for discussion. Often most people come straight to me with these things and there is nothing wrong with that. But this is another avenue for bringing ideas forward. These members of pastoral council are responsible for being active members of our community and of being aware of the needs of the community. They help to guide Father Paul and I in the vision and mission of our parishes. They make us aware of what people are saying and are concerned about in our community. So, if you have an idea or thought that you’d like them to bring to council, please let them know.

I know that you pray for your priests. I ask that you also pray for these members of pastoral council as they help guide our parish’s pastoral activity.

Some Frequently Asked Questions

- ◆ Should I make my contribution by check or cash? Either is fine and both are appreciated. We would like to note that using a check creates a safeguard for you and the parish. Checks are endorsed with a “for deposit only” stamp, and are traceable for tax purposes and in case of errors.
- ◆ I did not receive my envelopes, what should I do? Occasionally some people do not receive their monthly packet of envelopes. Even the envelope company is not sure why this happens. If you do not receive your packet simply please call the parish office.
- ◆ If I write a check for a second collection, to whom should it be made payable? Unless directed to do otherwise, all checks should be made payable to either Visitation or St. Pius X Churches. The money taken in from a second collection is deposited in the church account, and then a single check is sent to the diocese. This procedure follows diocesan accounting guidelines.

Please avoid using tape, staples or glue.

Do not assume that because your parents are registered that you are automatically registered as an adult. This is a necessity for being a godparent or confirmation sponsor. You are not permitted to be either if you are not an active, registered and practicing Catholic.

Do you know of someone who is interested in learning about the Catholic Church?

Are you drawn to the Catholic Church and would like to learn what Catholics believe? Are you someone who was baptized Catholic, but not fully initiated? (Did not receive the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation.) Each of us is on a journey to deepen our relationship with Jesus Christ. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the setting for individuals to learn what it means to be a Catholic Christian. This is an opportunity for you to discover what Catholics believe and discern if you are called to this journey of faith. Individuals from the parish walk with you, sharing their faith and allowing you to question and explore what it means to live as a Catholic Christian. We gather to pray, to read Scripture, to explore topics of our faith tradition and to support one another in this journey. As a first step, there will be inquiry sessions through the summer months; we usually meet a couple of times a month. It is a time to ask questions or have discussions about introductory information concerning the Catholic faith. Then in early September, we normally meet on a weekly basis. At that time we begin a deeper and more intense exploration of the faith. If you would like to speak with someone about the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), please call the parish office (724-547-1911) to speak with Fr. Dan Carr or Cindy Copeland.



Along with celebrating the 15th Sunday in Ordinary, July 16th is the Feast of our Lady of Mount Carmel.

Mount Carmel was a holy place hundreds of years before Christ. There the prophet Elijah challenged the prophets of the pagan god, Baal, to a contest where the power of God was shown forth. Later, in the early centuries of Christianity, people who wanted to pray and grow close to God settled on the slopes of Mount Carmel. In time a monastery was built there. In the year 1251, the prior-general of the Carmelites, Simon Stock, had a vision of Mary the mother of God. Today became the special feast day of the Carmelite Order. In the 18th century the feast was extended to the whole church. It is celebrated widely in Italy, where people parade through the streets and carry a statue of Mary. Italian Americans have kept up the custom.
