

From the Desk of Fr. Dan

Lord, I love your commands.
Our responsorial psalm this week can be a difficult one to pray. We live in a society where freedom of choice is emphasized – probably over-emphasized. Any restrictions

on our freedom can seem unhelpful or even wrong. So, we don't like commandments and laws. We don't like someone telling us what we can and cannot do. So, we push back against the Church's teachings, especially those with which we disagree.

I think most of us know the importance of laws and commandments. They hold society together and give us healthy expectations of how we are to live together. So, most of us try to follow the rules and obey the commandments. However, we often do so begrudgingly. It's one thing to obey commandments. It's another thing entirely to love them. Yet, that is what we are praying in this psalm. How can we love God's commands when they can be so difficult, so unreasonable?

To answer this question, I think it's helpful to imagine yourself sitting with our Founding Fathers as they set out to establish our US Constitution. They were setting out to establish a set of rules and laws on which a country's foundation would be laid. Think about how intimidating that prospect would be. Any legal system depends on its fairness and consistency. All the laws must fit together in harmony. So, where would they begin? How would the laws they make fit together? What happens when there are conflicts between two laws? What if they put the system into place and it doesn't work? Fortunately, they did not start with nothing. They had other governments to use as an example. Far more importantly, they had God's law to use as a model. John Adams, our second President of the United States, once wrote:

"Suppose a nation in some distant region should take the Bible for their only law book, and every member should regulate his conduct by the precepts there exhibited!...What a eutopia, what a paradise would this region be."

This is why we should love God's commandments and the teachings of the Church. They are the only commands that are truly just and truly consistent. They lead us to true happiness and fulfillment. They are the laws and commands that will govern us in heaven. Every time we seek to throw them off, we will only be led down a path of destruction. The sooner we can follow His commands, the sooner we'll be ready to live with Him in paradise. This is why we love His commands, even when they are difficult. We may not always like them, but we do love them, because the One who shares them with us loves us even more.

What is a Sponsor Certificate and how is one obtained?

A sponsor certificate verifies that a person belongs to a particular parish and attends Sunday Mass regularly there. The certificate also verifies that someone fulfills all the Church requirements to be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, including age, the completion of the Sacraments of Initiation, and if married, being in a valid marriage. A sponsor certificate can be obtained by calling the parish office. When a person is asked to be a sponsor, sometimes he or she is not sure of this role or the Church's expectations. This becomes an opportunity for us to learn once again the meaning behind some of the Church's practices. Those who are choosing sponsors are advised to choose carefully.


