



I suspect that there are some in our community who expected to come to Mass and hear me preach about the situation in the Middle East. There are two main reasons why I didn't preach on it. The first is because I honestly didn't have the time to learn enough about it to speak on the situation. The

second reason is that I didn't think I really needed to speak authoritatively on something that I think is selfevident—what's happening is terrible and we need to pray for peace. I do want to apologize for not praying for peace at the end of a couple of Masses because of the many things happening in our community. That was an unintentional omission on my part, and I apologize if it upset anyone.

Having had a little more time to reflect, I do have some thoughts I'd like to offer. The first is that the situation in Gaza/Israel is extremely complicated. When the modern nation of Israel was established post-World War II, the land was taken from Palestinians whose ancestors had lived there for hundreds of years and given to Jewish people. No matter how you look at it, this was an injustice to those people. Since that time, the resentment has only grown on both sides and while there have been periods of non-violence, there has never been real peace.

Another thing to consider is that the nation of Israel is not a continuation of the chosen people of God from two millennia ago. It is a modern nation-state in the same way that France or Egypt is today. I think that some believe that Israel ought to have a special place in modern society. But Jesus came to establish a new people of God—the Church—in which all people in every nation are invited to participate. Just because Israel is in the same location under the same name as God's chosen people long ago does not mean that it has the same right of place in salvation history.

Finally, although the two sides are different in terms of religion (Jewish and Muslim), the issue is not primarily religious. It is political. It certainly doesn't help that "love your enemies" is not a part of either religion, but this is really about land and power. Both sides want to destroy each other because of past hatreds. I wish I could say that if both sides were Christian instead that this wouldn't happen—being predominantly Christian has not stopped the war for the last 2,000 years.

Hamas has initiated open conflict in a horrific way that is terrible and wrong. Destruction of a group of people will not bring true peace. We must pray for a peaceful resolution to this conflict that respects the dignity of all people on both sides. It may seem impossible for both sides to be open to forgiveness given the history. But we know that nothing is impossible for God.




