From the Desk of Fr. Dan

Wrath and anger are hateful things, From the yet the sinner hugs them tight. -Sirach 27:30

One of the most common things that gets confessed in the confessional is anger.
Anger at parents, spouses and children,

anger at co-workers, anger at the government, anger at all sorts of people. Even anger at God. We get angry and we know it's wrong. But is it?

Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money-changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and the oxen, and spilled the coins of the money-changers and over-turned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of scripture, "Zeal for your house will consume me." -John 2:13-17.

It seems that Jesus got angry at least once. Maybe some would argue that he didn't. It doesn't explicitly say that he was angry when he did this, but I have to believe that he performed this sign out of a just anger, not as some impassionate, calculated move.

What do I mean when I say, "just anger"? We know that wrath is one of the seven deadly sins. And it is —that's what our passage from Sirach points out. However, God made us capable of anger for a reason. The reason is that we live in a sinful world. And we should get angry about sin. If we see someone being robbed or harmed by another, we should do something about it if we can. The emotion of anger is designed to give us the strength to fight for what's right when we see an injustice taking place. One of my former spiritual directors once said that when dealing with sin, "sometimes you have to get a little [peeved]" (he used another word). Anger is meant to fight against sin and evil. When it does, it is a "just anger" and not sinful.

The trouble is, we often misuse the anger that we feel. We use it selfishly when we don't get what we want instead of fighting for what God wants. This is how Jesus uses it when he sees the monetary abuses that were happening in the temple. He wanted to stop people from sinning.

So, if you struggle with anger, it's worth considering the following question: how much of my anger is about an injustice—what is truly wrong and offends God—and how much of my anger is selfish and about what I want? The former is not sinful, while the latter is and should be confessed. Normally, I find that there's a bit of a mix of both in most situations and we should pray to God asking for our anger to be purified from selfishness.


Also, if God made you to have a quick temper, I wonder in what way the Lord might be asking you to use it to fight evil and sin for Him rather than to use it selfishly to get your way.

An explanation of what we mean when we pray in the Creed: "I BELIEVE IN THE COMMUNION OF SAINTS." The Communion of Saints is a doctrine that was included in the Apostles Creed which was used some time around the year 100. It is based on St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. In Chapter 12, St. Paul compares Christians to a single body in which each member contributes to the food of all and shares in the welfare of all. "For as with the human body which is a unity although it has many parts—all the parts of the body, though many, still making up one single body—so it is with Christ." (v12) When St. Paul used the words saints in his writing, he was speaking of believers in Christ, both living and dead. Through our baptism, we pass into eternal life. In Catholic terminology, the Communion of Saints is said to comprise the Church Militant (those of us who are alive on earth), and the Church Penitent (those undergoing purification in purgatory in preparation for heaven), and the Church Triumphant (those already in heaven). The damned are not among the Communion of Saints.

What is most beautiful about this doctrine is the belief that those who are in heaven are in the presence of God. They constantly intercede with the Father for us. We think nothing asking our close friends and relatives to pray for us. The saints in heaven are our friends and relatives as well. They are part of the Body of Christ whose prayers help us here on earth. St. Dominic said, "Do not weep, for I shall be more useful to you after my death and I shall help you then more effectively than during my life." The Church also encourages us to imitate the holiness of the saints because they imitated the holiness of Christ. First among saints is our Blessed Mother, Mary Queen of Heaven. She is the guintessential model for us all and never ceases to intercede on our behalf with her Son.
