During the month of November, as the natural world around us begins to "die" and prepare for winter, we as a church begin to ponder the "last things" and, uncoincidentally, come to the end of the liturgical year. A big part of this process involves pondering the end of our earthly lives. This is something we are often reluctant to do. Our world attempts to avoid situations where death is present at all costs. We want to be shielded from any confrontation with death because it makes us uneasy and uncomfortable. This is because, no matter how much we learn about our universe, no matter how advanced we become scientifically and technologically, we cannot see beyond death. We cannot know what is to come.

Although we all know that we must die, we cannot easily face that reality. In our minds it might make sense, but in our hearts, we cannot fathom it. This is why we face it together as a faith community every year. We remember that we must die. And in some way, we prepare ourselves to face it.

St. Paul points out in his first letter to the Thessalonians that anyone without faith in the resurrection can have no hope about death. This despair leads to an insufferable grieving. Thus, many avoid thinking about death. You might be wondering though: if death causes me to grieve, does that mean that I don't believe? Certainly not. In our minds we might believe, but our hearts are often slower to believe.

The difference between the believer and the unbeliever is in the manner of grieving. St. Paul is not telling us not to grieve when someone dies or when we consider the possibility of our own death. He is saying not to grieve **like the rest, who have no hope.** If we have faith in Christ and hope in the resurrection, our grieving of loss should be much different over time. Our deep abiding sorrow should slowly make way for a hopeful expectation. As our hearts catch up with our heads, our faith in Christ brings us hope, peace, and comfort rather than despair, anger, and bitterness. The grieving may be just as painful, but the result should look different.

Although we cannot see beyond the veil, although death makes us uneasy and sad, we trust in the goodness of God and the promises that Jesus makes. Amid the joys and the sufferings of life, we run the race with hope, trusting that death is not the end.

My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish.

# Notes from our Administrator, Ir. Paul:

I would like to offer a thank you to all those who have been involved in recent fundraisers for our parishes.

- 1) A big thank you to Fr. Dan's mother, Linda, and to Fr. Dan for putting together the Mama Carr's Dinner fundraiser which benefited both parish summer festivals. The total amount of profit was \$2,400, which added \$1,200 to each parish festival profit. Barbara Golobish was the winner. She described the evening as fun and entertaining, and she said the food was delizioso.
- 2) As the recent Mt. Pleasant Glass Festival was held on a wet September weekend, our volunteers braved the raindrops & puddles, and both of our parishes profited from their determination and hard work.
- St. Pius X's booth brought in \$18,304.00 and had expenses of \$3,876.84. The profit for the weekend was \$14,427.16. Visitation's booth brought in \$13,316.00 and had expenses of \$3,310.85. The profit for the weekend was \$10,005.15.

### LITURGY OF THE HOURS

Where does Evening Prayer or Vespers come from? It has as its source the Liturgy of the Hours. You may then ask, "What is Liturgy of the Hours?" It is the public prayer of the Church for praising God and sanctifying the day. One of the promises that an individual makes during his ordination is that of praying the Divine Office, a.k.a., the Liturgy of the Hours. Even though it is a promise made by the ordained, it certainly is not a prayer that is exclusive to the ordained. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "The Liturgy of the Hours is intended to become the prayer of the whole People of God." (1174) It holds such an important place in the life of the **Church that The Constitution of the Sacred Liturgy** (Sacrosanctum Concilium), from the Second Vatican Council, has an entire chapter devoted to it. The document points out that the entire Church, the ordained and non-ordained, "...by celebrating the Eucharist and in other ways, especially the celebration of the divine office, is ceaselessly engaged in praising the Lord and interceding for the salvation of the entire world." (83)

There are apps available to anyone who wishes to pray the Liturgy of the Hours during the day or daily.
