From the Desk of Fr. Dan As we prepare for "Mass intention season", I thought it would be helpful to offer a Q&A about the practice here.

Q: Why do we offer Mass for our deceased loved ones? A: Mass intentions are a part of the Church's practice of praying for those in purgatory. It dos not make sense to pray for our loved ones if they are

not in purgatory, as the saints in heaven don't need our prayers & the souls in hell cannot be helped by our prayers. So, we pray for our loved ones in case they still need purified from their sins before they enter heavenly glory.

Q: If I think my loved one is in heaven, should I not offer a Mass intention? A: It's ok to hope that our loved ones are in heaven, but it is our Christian duty and a spiritual work of mercy to pray for the dead. It's ok to "play it safe".

Q: What does offering a Mass accomplish? A: The Mass is a sacrifice that shares in the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross. Jesus took on the guilt of all the sins ever committed and all the sins that will ever be committed. When we offer a Mass intention, our petition receives a portion of the bottomless ocean of grace that Christ won for us on Good Friday.

Q: What is the cost of a Mass intention? A: We do not "sell" Mass intentions, as it is not appropriate to sell and buy God's grace. However, we do ask for a customary donation of \$10. This offering goes to the priest who celebrates the Mass.

Q: How many people can you name in a Mass intention?
A: There is no limit to the number of people who can be prayed for in a Mass intention. God isn't measuring our grace with measuring cups—you get 1/2 Mass worth, and you get 1/2 Mass. It doesn't work like that because the sacrifice of the Mass shares in God's boundless generosity. We have permission from the Diocese to offer an additional intention at four Masses each week. With this permission, we can offer two intentions at some Masses. (Note that the priest doesn't get to keep both stipends—the extra stipend goes to the Diocesan Retired Clergy Fund.)

Q: Does a person have to be dead to be named in a Mass intention? A: No, you can offer Masses for the living. This is why we started announcing the Mass intention separately from the prayer for those who have died in our general intercessions at Mass.

Q: Can I offer Mass intentions for non-Catholics? What about pets? A: You can offer Mass intentions for any person, Catholic or not. However, you cannot offer a Mass for a deceased pet or animal.

Q: What is a Pro Popolo Mass? A: Pro Popolo is a Latin phrase that means "for the people". This Mas intention is for everyone who belongs to our partner parishes. To this point, we have been offering this Mass intention under the title "Parish Families", which isn't fully accurate. We have also been applying this Mass intention during a weekday Mass, which is not what Church law requires us to do. Moving forward, we'll be offering this intention weekly at one of our four weekend Masses.

THANKSGIVING DAY in the United States comes at the end of November, a bit late in the year for a typical harvest festival. The growing season is over. In some parts of the country, snow has already fallen. The pilgrims, the Calvinist settlers in New England, held the first Thanksgiving Day celebration in 1621. Many of the English settlers did not celebrate Easter or Christmas. They had abandoned Catholic feast days and seasons, but they were devoted to the Bible. They based their laws and customs on it. Thanksgiving Day didn't become an annual event until much later. In 1789, President George Washington proclaimed a day of thanksgiving for the new country. For many years after that, some states celebrated one day, some on another. In 1863, in the midst of the Civil War, Abraham Lincoln proclaimed the 4th Thursday of November as the official Thanksgiving Day of the Nation.

The Law of Moses calls the people to share their bounty with family servants, strangers, widows and orphans. Today in America, many people have no way to share on Thanksgiving Day, because they are hungry, homeless, or isolated from family and friends. On Thanksgiving Day, we remember them and welcome them with our prayer and our service. Together as parish families let us give thanks by gathering for the Liturgy of Thanksgiving this Thursday, November 23, 9:00 a.m. in Visitation Church.

As we approach the national holiday of Thanksgiving, one of the thoughts is to list items that we are thankful for in our lives this month. Our parishes have been always blessed with the help of volunteerism from some of our parishioners. We have achieved some great work as parish families. This could not have been accomplished without volunteer help from our parishioners, and even some people outside of our parishes. I wish to thank all those who volunteered their time and talents to make our projects and fundraisers become realities. They would not have happened without you. On behalf of our parishes, thank you for your help. I am so thankful for people like you, who are a part of our parish families. May God continue to bless you now, and I look forward to your help again in the near future. Fr. Paul


