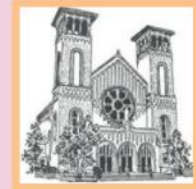

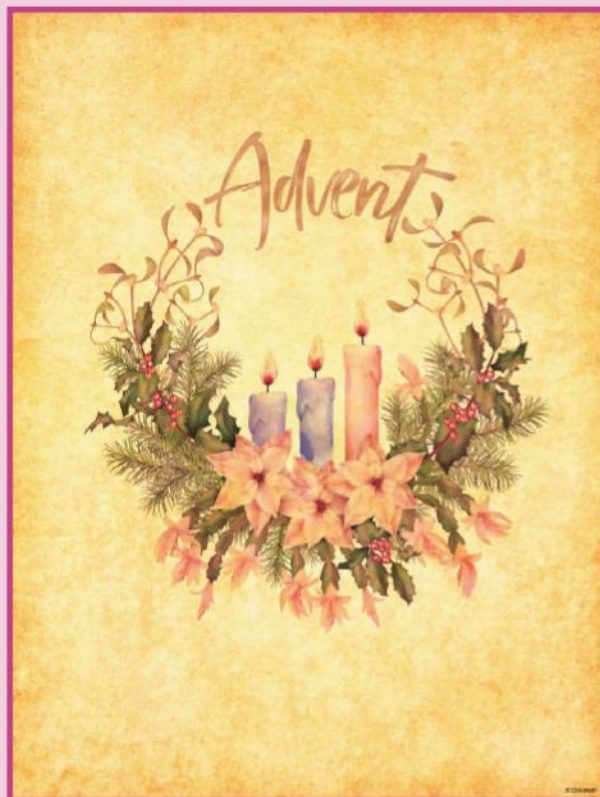

*When things happen to you that you can't change, you can either choose to be happy about them or choose to be sad about them. – my mom*

As a child, I can remember my siblings and I being upset over stupid, little things. You know how kids can be. If we didn't get our way or something we wanted, we made a big fuss out of it and moped and sighed for a while.

This is when my mother would tell us that we should choose to be happy instead of sad. While anyone who has dealt with depression knows it's not as simple as choosing to be happy or sad, there is a theological truth hidden in her motherly wisdom. I would call it the difference between happiness and joy.

Although you can quibble with my use of terms, let's just say that happiness is something that you feel. Some days we feel happy, and some days we don't. Usually, it's connected to how our day is going. If we have an unexpected, pleasant surprise, it brings us happiness and delight. If we have an unexpected, unpleasant surprise, it often takes our happiness away. So, happiness depends upon our circumstances in life which can change and fluctuate seemingly at random.

Joy is different from this. Joy is something deeper. It is a gift of the Holy Spirit that resides within us and transcends mere emotion. It does not change with the random effects of life.

Someone who is joyful is not simply ignorant of the bad things that happen to them. They are simply aware that, in the grand scheme of things, they are nothing compared to what they have that is everlasting – God's love. You can be both sad and joyful at the same time – sad that something is not right or perfect, but joyful that God is still present in the sad moments of life. In fact, although I am not a psychologist, I believe that joy is the truest answer to depression – a deep, abiding knowledge of God's love can penetrate any sadness that we might have.

I think this joy is what my mother meant. On this Gaudete Sunday, we tell the world to "Rejoice". Not because we feel wonderful today. Not because everything is going our way. It's because deep within us remains a sense of God's love that brings us joy. We pray for an abundance of that gift of joy, so that no matter what our life's situation might bring, we might look forward to singing "Joy to the World" when our Savior comes on Christmas.

### **SOMETHING NEW: "A NEWBORN BABY"**

Of all the varied Christmas decorations, nothing can convey the true meaning of this time as well as a creche. Be it a picture, wooden carving or even a creche with live people in front of a church, here is the good news that God has come to us in the form of a little newborn baby. "Joy to the World! The Lord is come!"

One dictionary gives an interesting definition of "newborn". It is: 1.) Recently born; 2.) Born anew. Sometimes, as we look at the creche and marvel at God's gift, our faith is born anew within us. It is not that our old faith has been denied, but it has been renewed. It might be compared to a fire in a fireplace, which is still giving out heat but has burned down to glowing embers. Then someone adds a new log and soon flames curl up and around it, brightening the room and giving greater warmth.

When we celebrate Christmas with our focus on the newborn Jesus, our faith can be renewed and our hearts warmed. Newborn! How we need to let the miracle happen within us! It does not take a lot of work on our part. We do not earn a miracle. We may not even feel that we deserve it, but God gives it to us. God's love and human love are miraculous, wonderful gifts.

In order to receive this gift, it may help if we let our minds and spirit grow quiet. Wait for God's gift to be reborn within us!

Dec. 21: O Daystar, you are the eternal light, the sun of justice. *(Come and cheer us; dispel the darkness.)*

This Wednesday, Friday and Saturday, after the third Sunday of Advent are the **WINTER EMBER DAYS**.

All Wednesdays and Fridays of the year used to be fasting days. On these days people tried to pray more, give more to charity, and eat less. Many people still do this. The Wednesday, Friday and Saturday before the fourth Sunday of Advent were the winter Ember Days. In lands around the Mediterranean Sea, olives are harvested at this time of year. So the winter Ember Days were days of thanksgiving for the olive harvest. (The word "ember" means "season".) The bishops of the United States have not yet set special dates for the Ember Days. Many people try to fast and pray and give extra charity on three weekdays before Thanksgiving. Christmas, too, is a harvest festival. That is why we bake and serve so many good, rich foods. Perhaps, keeping the 12 Days of Christmas is like saying a long grace before the meals that have fed us in the past year, and like saying grace before the meals that will feed us in the new year to come. Extra prayer, fasting and giving thanks during Advent are ways to thank Our Father.

### **MORE THAN THE MANGER**

Amid the bustle of December, it's easy to forget that our Advent preparation is about more than the arrival of a baby in a manger. In the early Church, all of life pointed toward Christ's second coming, which Christians expected to occur within their lifetimes. Not until the fourth century did the feast of the Nativity take root, and with it, the time of preparation: Advent, from the Latin word *adventus*, or coming.

To meditate on the end times is to discern whether we are truly prepared to meet God, if we are living out our faith or simply going through the motions. Admitting our own weakness calls us to act, to prepare...even to repent. This is a word we don't often associate with Advent, but which is implicit in the Scriptures we hear early in the season.

This Advent, take time to seek stillness and hear the Lord speaking. Pray. How else will you prepare to welcome "God with us"?
