From of Fr. Dan

Exactly 800 years ago, St. Francis of Assisi preached on Christthe Desk mas Eve Mass in the small town of Greccio. What made this particular Mass so noteworthy was not the message he gave. It was the presence of something new.

It was the very first manger scene. St. Francis felt that in seeing physically the face of the Christ child, hearts would be enlightened as to the great gift given to us in the Incarnation the fact that God Himself became man.

The Israelites tended to keep God at a distance out of reverence for his holiness. As a sinful nation, Israel knew that they could not be in God's presence in their sin lest they die. The prophet Isaiah expresses this when he has a vision of being in God's presence. "Woe to me, I am doomed! For I am a man of unclean lips." (Is 6:5) The same applies to us as sinners. We do not belong in God's presence unless we're freed from all sin

Despite this truth, God himself chose to come down from heaven to dwell with sinners. The Pharisees were shocked when Jesus shared his meals with sinners because of social protocol. Never did they imagine the true scandal of God sharing a place at table with sinners who do not belong in His presence. This is the power of the Incarnation. This is the power of Christ becoming one of us.

When we gaze upon the face of the Christ child, we remember what a gift it is that God choose to come down and dwell with us sinners. He walks with us, despite our imperfections and impurities. We don't need to find Him. He came and found us.

My hope is that of St. Francis - that by coming to Church on Christmas, approaching the manger scene, and gazing on the face of the Christ child, you will remember what a gift He is for us. God does not stay off at a distance and wait for us to be ready to come to Him. He comes to us amid our sinfulness to forgive us, walk with us, and call us to something more. Merry Christmas and God bless.

Notes from our Administrator, Fr. Paul:

"TAKE MY ROOM!"

Christmas pageants can be happy, but they can also be devastating when something goes wrong. The director has frazzled nerves and anxious parents sitting on the edge of their pews, hoping that Johnny and Susie won't forget their lines. Somehow, usually things turn out all right, and by the Grace of God the beautiful message of Christmas joy shines through.

Billy had been assigned the role of the innkeeper of Bethlehem. He was supposed to say, "I'm sorry, but there is no room. We're all filled up. Go out to the stables. You can find shelter there." Instead, Billy forgot his lines and became confused. With tears in his eyes, he blurted out, "Please don't go away! You can have my room!"

That is true devotion, and it speaks to our condition today. What can we give? There are three things, among others, that we certainly can give. We can give cheerfulness. Even if we are not feeling good ourselves, it is amazing what a pleasant change will occur within our souls if we act as if we are happy and were cheerful toward others. We can give kindness. Yes, there is a too, too kind of condescending solicitude like that of the man who wanted to shield some ducks from the rain with his umbrella! Just simple, thoughtful kindness will radiate the joy of Christmas, and all will light around us. We can be helpful to others. We can't do everything, but we can do something. Guided by the Lord, as we seek His will, we shall be doing the right thing.

Fr. Dan and I pray that each of you may make "room" in your heart for the Christ Child and invite Him into it. May you be enveloped by the joy of Christmas today and throughout the coming year as you share kindness, cheerfulness and a helping hand to those you share time with together. Please know that we are remembering you in our Christmas Masses. May the Christ Child bless you for your gift of yourself.


restore some kind of personal touch, retailers encouraged their customers to wrap their presents.


