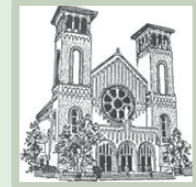

If we preach the gospel, this is no reason for me to boast, for an obligation has been imposed on me, and woe to me if I do not preach it! - 1 Cor 9:16

Some say our national pastime is baseball. Not me. It's gossip. - Erma Bombeck

St. Paul reminds us in our second reading that sharing the Gospel is an obligation. However, I've found that most of us tend to be much more likely to share gossip than the Gospel with one another. And I think I know part of why that is.

When we gossip, we are sharing something that we know the other person is interested in hearing—possibly for the wrong reason. We tend to do this for several reasons. Perhaps we are telling someone something they want to hear and it makes us feel good to have their attention and esteem. "Wow, where did you hear this? You must know a lot of important people." Perhaps we are looking for the other person to validate our judgment of the person of whom we speak. "I would NEVER do what they did!" This makes us feel better about ourselves.

Perhaps we are inviting them to share something juicy with us. "I shouldn't say this to you, but since you told me that, I'll tell you." This "information exchange" satisfies our curiosity and gives us even more things to share with others.

Regardless of why we do it, gossiping makes us feel good in the moment, but guilty later. Sharing the Gospel does the opposite. It can be awkward to bring up our faith at first, but it makes us feel much better long-term. In a way, the Gospel accomplishes what gossip tries to do and fails. Sharing how God is working in my life lets me feel good without tearing someone else down. And it invites someone else to share how God has been working in their own life. This kind of an experience can be transformative for us and for the other person. It reminds us all how much we are loved by God.

Maybe we could all stand to talk a little less about our neighbors and a little more about Jesus. We know that others are interested in our gossip. We also know they should be even more interested in the Gospel. It will do much more for their soul than a tidbit of information could ever do.

Notes from our Administrator,

Fr. Paul:

An explanation of what we mean when we pray in the Creed, "I BELIEVE IN THE COMMUNION OF SAINTS.": The Communion of Saints is a doctrine that was included in the Apostles Creed which was used some-time around the year 100. It is based on St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. In Chapter 12, St. Paul compares Christians to a single body in which each member contributes to the good of all and shares in the welfare of all. "For as with the human body which is a unity although it has many parts—all the parts of the body, though many, still making up one single body—so it is with Christ." (v12) When St. Paul used the word saints in his writing, he was speaking of believers in Christ, both living and dead. Through our Baptism, we pass into eternal life. In Catholic terminology, the Communion of Saints is said to comprise the Church Militant (those of us who are alive on earth), the Church Penitent (those undergoing purification in purgatory in preparation for heaven), and the Church Triumphant (those already in heaven). The damned are not among the Communion of Saints. What is the most beautiful about this doctrine is the belief that those who are in heaven are in the presence of God. They constantly intercede with the Father for us. We think nothing about asking our close friends and relatives to pray for us. The saints in heaven are our friends and relatives as well. They are part of the body of Christ whose prayers help us here on earth. St. Dominic said, "Do not weep, for I shall be more useful to you after my death and I shall help you then more effectively than during my life." The Church also encourages us to imitate the holiness of the saints because they imitated the holiness of Christ. First among saints is our Blessed Mother, Mary Queen of Heaven. She is the quintessential model for us all and never ceases to intercede on our behalf with her Son.
