

From the Desk of Fr. Dan One of the most famous passages in the Bible comes from 1 Corinthians 13 where St. Paul describes love in a very beautiful way. It is patient, it is kind, it does not boast, it is not rude, etc. The poetic recitation goes on at length. But many who hear it do not understand why St. Paul is speak-

ing in this way about love. To understand, we need to go back one chapter to Chapter 12.

In Chapter 12, St. Paul addresses some of the division taking place among the Corinthian community. They are judging one another based on their spiritual gifts. Some have gifts of healing, others of tongues, others of prophecy, etc. The community was allowing their evaluation of the gifts of God and their perceived importance to pull them apart into cliquishness and envy.

So, St. Paul points out in verses 4-11 that, yes, there are many different spiritual gifts. But they all come from the same place: God. God gives out his gifts not as we want but as he knows we need them. Not everyone needs the gift of healing or prophecy. We need all of the gifts to be distributed among the members of the community. And just because one person has a gift that we might value higher than another, doesn't mean that the person is more important. We need all of the gifts that God gives us to build up a healthy Church. St. Paul then explains in verses 12-31 about how the Church resembles a body and each of us are parts of the body. Some parts may seem to be weaker, but they are all the more necessary. Likewise, some people in the Church seem weaker or less necessary, but they are not.

Then St. Paul says, "Strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts. But I shall show you a still more excellent way." It is here that Chapter 13 begins and St. Paul begins his description of love. He says that you might have the most amazing and impressive gifts – healing, prophecy, whatever – but if you don't have love, they are worthless and wasted. Love is at the heart of how we are to use our giftedness. We are to share our gifts with one another patiently, kindly, humbly, etc.

Our second readings in the last few weeks from 1 John have focused a great deal on love. We hear that "God is love", but love can mean so many things in English. John is talking about the same love as St. Paul. It is a charitable love, a love that serves others. When we share our gifts with one another out of love for them, we become more like our God who is love.



OUR BIBLE STUDY CONCLUDES for this spring on Tuesday, May 7th. Please join us for the upcoming gathering from 6-7:30 p.m. in the St. Pius X social hall. During our sixth session, we will be studying the Biblical roots of the Mass from three passages

of the Bible: Luke 24:13-35 (the appearance on the road to Emmaus); Acts 2:42-27 (communal life); and Revelation 21:9 -27 (the New Jerusalem).

# Notes from our Administrator, In. Paul:

MAY 9, THIS THURSDAY, IS THE FEAST OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD, a holy day of obligation. The celebration of Easter is the oldest yearly festival of the church. We know this because we still have a few of the writings od second-century Christians, such as Bishop Polycarp of Smyrna. When he was young he was taught by some of Jesus' disciples.

On the night of the Jewish Passover, Polycarp celebrated in memory of the death and resurrection of Christ. Other groups of Christians celebrated on the Saturday night and Sunday that followed the Passover. In those earliest years of the church, once a year at Passover time Christians celebrated the fullness of Jesus—His birth and baptism, His life and teachings, His death, burial and resurrection. They celebrated the glory of Christ and the sending of the Holy Spirit. Especially in the fourth and fifth centuries, new holy days were kept in celebration of gospel events. That's when most Christians started to celebrate Christmas, Epiphany, the Presentation, the Annunciation, the birth of John the Baptist and many other festivals. This didn't happen everywhere at the same time. There were different ways of celebrating and different ways of calculating the seasons.

In the late fourth century many Christians began to celebrate a feast day in memory of the Ascension of the Lord. In most places this was kept on the 40th day of the 50 days of Easter rejoicing. St. Paul wrote to the church in Ephesus: "The fullness of Christ fills all in all." That is what we celebrate on Ascension Day. This day is not about the absence of Christ. It is about Christ's presence. At the conclusion of Matthew's gospel, Jesus says, "I am with you always."

Because the feast of the Ascension is a Holy Day of Obligation, all Catholics are obliged to attend Mass on that day. The Mass schedule here at our parishes is as follows: Wednesday, May 8, 6 p.m. vigil at Visitation and Thursday, May 9, 7 a.m. & 6 p.m. at St. Pius X. The PARISH OFFICE will be CLOSED on THURSDAY, May 9, in observance of ASCENSION THURSDAY.

ACORDING TO CHURCH LAW, TRINITY SUNDAY, MAY 26, is the last Sunday that you can make your Easter duty. The confession of sin cleanses us. Christ in Communion is our strength. Please do not deprive yourself of such gifts of healing, strength and love. Just for clarification, the precept of the Church is as follows: To lead a sacramental life; to receive the Sacrament of Penance regularly and Holy Communion frequently—minimally, at least once a year, between the first Sunday of Lent and Trinity Sunday.

# WEAR YOUR RED TO CELEBRATE PENTECOST! In two



weeks, on the weekend of May 18/19, we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, the conclusion of our 50 days of Eastertide and time of "extra" Alleluias! We encourage everyone to wear red on that weekend—to Mass and in public—as an outward sign of our belief that the Holy Spirit

dwells within and works through us. ALLELUIA!!!
