## Notes from our Pastor, Fr. Paul:

**ADVENT—AS AN UNSENTIMENTAL JOURNEY** Does Advent come to you with an “Ah!”—or with an “Aha!?”



Either would be better than a “Ho-hum!” The arrival of Advent heralds the beginning of a new year, a new “Christian Year” of remembering the events of Jesus’ life and ministry. Specifically, it invites us to spend time in preparation for the good news that comes with Jesus’ birth. An “Ah!” response might indicate a nostalgic feeling of remembering past Advents and the excitement of the pre-

Christmas season. An “Aha!” points to seeing this time as a challenge or an opportunity. The “Ah!” is a sentimental journey, the “Aha!” an unsentimental one. There is nothing wrong with sentiment, but Advent can be more meaningful, if we look at it as an opportunity.

Advent challenges us to look at our actions, our daily activities and or attitudes with careful scrutiny. Just as it is good to have a regular physical examination, so it is good to have a spiritual examination to remedy any ills that exist and take steps to prevent others from developing. The Advent season says to us: look at your total picture realistically. Step aside and see what is really going on. Face both the good and the bad and then see how God’s guidance might make your life more whole. Perhaps, the best way to start this unsentimental journey is to ask ourselves some practical questions. In absolute honesty, are you the person you want to be? Do your daily actions and attitude reflect the values you hold to be important? Most of us find some negative answers to such questions. If so, then this is the world into which Christ comes for you. Use this season to explore ways into which the light of Christ might brighten your life, both with new directions and new insights.

### THE ADVENT WREATH

#### *Its Symbols—Its Meanings*

- ◆ The wreath, a circle, expresses God’s unending eternity.
- ◆ Evergreen symbolizes God’s unchangeableness and our immortality.
- ◆ Four candles, one for each week of Advent, represent the many hundreds of years during which people awaited the Redeemer.
- ◆ Violet candles and ribbon remind us of longing expectation.
- ◆ The rose candle symbolizes joy and hope in awaiting the birth of Jesus.
- ◆ Red ribbon stands for Jesus’ blood shed on the cross.

**JUST A REMINDER,** there is an envelope in December’s packet for Christmas flowers and decorations. We will continue to accept them throughout the coming weeks. Donations may be given in memory of a deceased loved one, the sick, your own intentions, etc.



**THE FEAST OF ST. NICHOLAS**— This Friday, December 6, is the Feast of St. Nicholas. Nicholas may be the most popular saint of all time. Thousands of churches are named after him. He seems to be portrayed by artists more than any other saint, with the exception of Mary. Nicholas was the bishop of the city of Myra in Asia Minor, in what is now the nation of Turkey. Centuries after he died, his bones were brought to the city of Bari in Italy. People came to his tomb to pray and many were healed of their illnesses. According to a legend, when Nicholas was a baby and his parents brought him to church to be baptized, he jumped eagerly into the water. When he grew up and was named bishop, he became known as the “wonder maker.” He could heal the sick and calm storms.

A story is told about a man who was so poor that he could no longer buy food for his family. He was going to sell his daughters into slavery so they would not starve. Bishop Nicholas found out about this. So at night he tossed three bags of gold into their house through a



window. In many places, families are visited today by someone dressed up like St. Nicholas. His visit is usually scary. He is accompanied by a devil, who snorts and groans and who rattles chains. Bishop Nicholas tells each person in the family about the things they do wrong, and he encourages them to do better in the coming year. When he leaves, there is a feast. Tangerines are eaten as reminders of the gold he gave to help the poor women. Candy canes are reminders of his crosier, the shepherd’s staff that bishops carry.

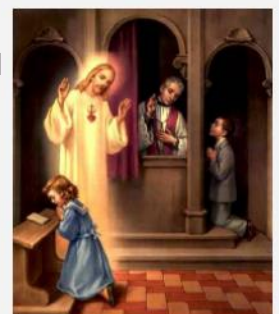


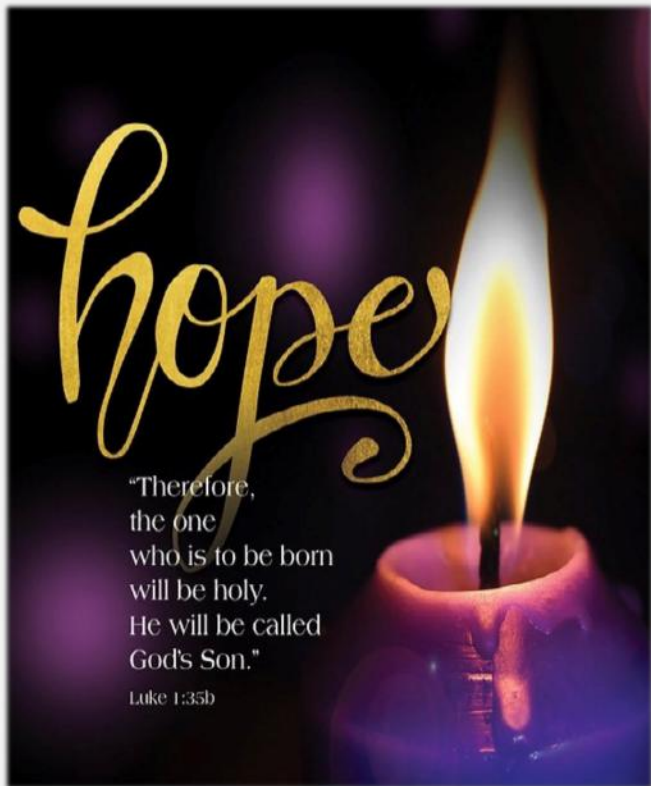

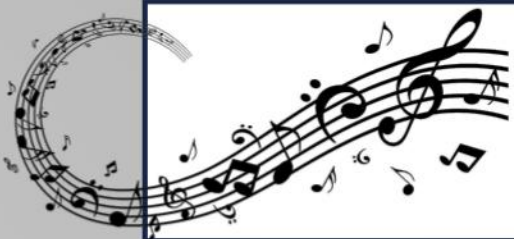


The *Visitation Christian Mothers* are planning their Christmas celebration at the Aaron's Building, 139 Pittsburgh Street, Connellsville, PA. The
