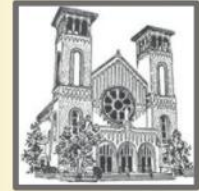

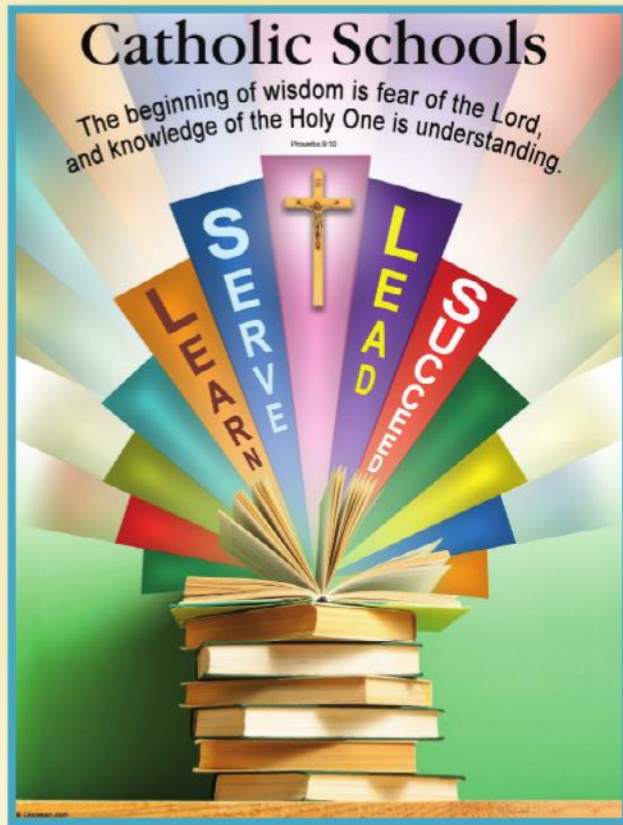

## *Notes from our Pastor, Fr. Paul:*

Annually, our Diocese participates in the Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe on the first Sunday of February. This year, the Collection will be taken at all parish Saturday evening Masses and Sunday Masses on February 1-2, 2025, as we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. The proceeds from this collection will help the Church to overcome the challenges of rebuilding after decades of atheistic communist rule, bringing light to 29 nations in Central and Eastern Europe, such as Lithuania, Bulgaria, the Czech Republic, Poland, Slovenia, Slovakia, Macedonia, and Ukraine. The citizens of Central and Eastern Europe have been freed from the evil of communism for over 30 years, but much work still remains to accomplish the restoration of the Church in this part of the world. Although the tyranny of communism did not snuff out the Catholic faith in these countries, the people of Central and Eastern Europe do need our assistance and financial help because they do not have the resources to "Restore the Church [and] Build the Future" on their own.

Because of the generous response from parishioners in past years, the Bishops of the United States were able to provide aid immediately when war and other forms of oppression brought suffering to the people of Central and Eastern Europe. The Bishops continue to respond to the cry of the poor in these nations, especially as wars continue and mass migration of refugees bring instability to these nations. For example, from 2022 through summer 2024, The Catholic University of Croatia was responsible for bringing students and faculty from European universities for a series of summer courses called, "Practicing Resilience—Preparing for Recovery," a program designed to prepare people spiritually, psychologically, and socially for the work of healing and recovery from the aftermath of war. Funding provided from our support of the collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe aided in making the program available for all participants. I hope that our parishioners will be comforted in knowing that their contributions to this collection do indeed make a difference in the lives of so many persons as they struggle to recover from former communist rule and present difficulties. Please be as generous as you can next weekend. Thank you very much.

## LITURGICAL CORNER

*Please explain what we mean when we pray in  
the Creed,  
"WE BELIEVE IN THE COMMUNION OF SAINTS."*

The Communion of Saints was a doctrine that was included in the Apostles Creed which was readily used sometime around the year 100. This doctrine is based on St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. In Chapter 12, St. Paul compares Christians to a single body in which each member contributes to the good of all and shares in the welfare of all. "For as with the human body which is a unity although it has many parts—all parts of the body, though many, still making up one single body—so it is with Christ." (v12) When St. Paul used the word saints in his writing, he was speaking of believers in Christ, both living and dead. Remember, that through our Baptism, we pass "from death to life; death no longer has dominion over us." When our earthly body dies, we pass into eternal life. In Catholic terminology, the Communion of Saints is said to comprise the Church Militant (those of us who are alive on earth), the Church Penitent (those undergoing Purification in Purgatory in preparation for heaven), and the Church Triumphant (those already in heaven). The damned are not among the Communion of Saints. What is most beautiful about this doctrine is the belief that those who are in heaven (Church Triumphant) are in the presence of God. They constantly intercede with the Father for us. We think nothing about asking our close friends and relatives to pray for us. The saints in heaven are our friends and relatives as well. They are part of the Body of Christ whose prayers help us here on earth. St. Dominic said, "Do not weep, for I shall be more useful to you after my death and I shall help you then more effectively than during my life." The Church also encourages us to imitate the holiness of the saints because they imitate the holiness of Christ. First among saints is our Blessed Mother, Mary Queen of Heaven. She is a quintessential model for us all and never ceases to intercede on our behalf with her Son.

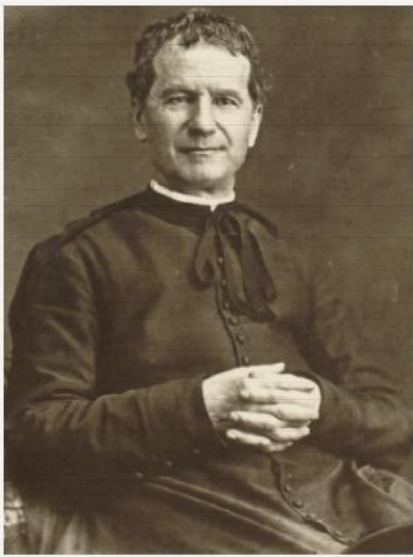

**THIS FRIDAY, JANUARY 31, IS THE FEAST DAY OF ST. JOHN BOSCO, presbyter, religious founder (1815-1888).**

To call others to Christ, John Bosco used everything he could think of, even acrobatic tricks and tightrope walking! His cleverness stood him in good stead. Many young people learned about God

because of the care they received from John. He was born in a small village in the Piedmont region of Italy. His father, a peasant farmer, died when John was only two years old, leaving the family very poor. When young John went away to the seminary at age 18, even the clothes on his back had been donated by people from his village.

John decided that his ministry would be in Turin, the closest city to his village. Turin was becoming an industrial town. Teenage boys would leave their poor families in the countryside and come into town searching for work. In the city, these teenagers lived in terrible conditions. Even before his ordination, John began taking a group of boys out to the country every Sunday for sports, a picnic, song and prayer. No one else cared about them. After John became a priest he housed boys who had nowhere else to live. Then he began programs to train them as shoemakers, tailors and printers. The training protected them from a harsh world they were too young to face. Many of the boys and young men John assisted were troubled. Often they had experienced abuse and neglect. Somehow John called forth the best in them by affirming them and treating them kindly. This was considered a very unusual approach to teaching. Most teachers in those days thought that children must be forced to learn and punished severely when they didn't.

The number of young people in John's care grew ever larger. He had trouble finding assistants who understood his gentle teaching methods. Eventually he began an order of priests and an order of sisters. He also started a group of laypeople called Cooperators. All were trained especially for this work. Today these orders serve in schools, colleges, seminaries, hospitals and missions all over the world.
