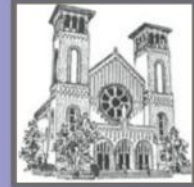

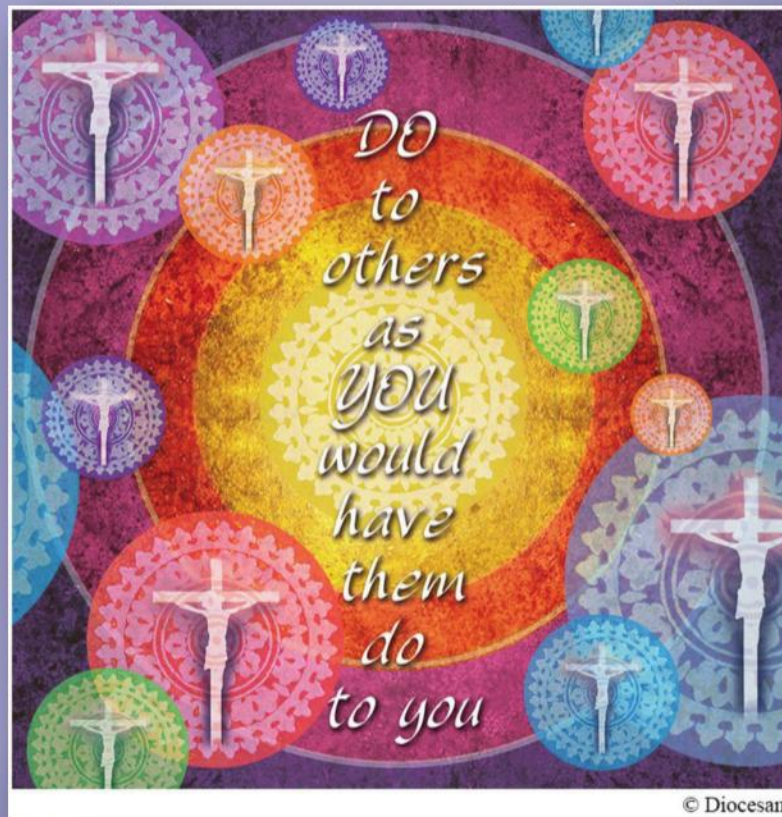

Notes from our Pastor, Fr. Paul:

I share with you some thoughts about our parishes... The winter has taken a toll on our government budgets, family and school budgets, and church budgets. I am reluctant to begin to tabulate what this winter is doing to our parish budget. The cost of snow and ice removal and maintenance, fuel costs to heat our buildings, and loss of revenue due to decline in Mass attendance due to weather. Please take these into consideration when planning your weekly gift to the Church; we need a parish-wide increase in giving, particularly from those who are able but who have not increased their giving for quite some time. And thanks to those who have responded generously to that plea already. Please remember to return your Sunday envelopes for the weekends you couldn't attend Mass because of the weather. Our expenses do not cease but increase at this time of year. Please, the parishes continue to need your support.

Secondly, as Lent approaches, we will begin our annual Diocesan Lenten Appeal. The Diocese sets a goal for us and after we reach the goal, all monies then collected will benefit our parish needs. In the past, we have used the money generated by the DLA to not only balance our budget but also to fund many of the projects we have completed at each of the parishes. Within the next few weeks, we will share with you our goal and projects we hope to accomplish this year with our share of the DLA. I hope you'll be as generous this year as you have been in the past and hopefully even more so. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5. While our devotions and prayers for Lent are traditions at our two parishes, I'll be changing the schedule of Masses and devotions this Lent a little, so that parishioners may participate at any church according to their personal needs. ~Fr. 9. The first shall be last and the last shall be first only applies to the Kingdom of God. All other circumstances just demonstrate poor time management.
10. If you arrive early, you have a better shot at getting to sit in the back pews.



Prop Us Up, Lord! Prop Us Up!!

There was an old fellow who always prayed, "Lord, prop us up on our leaning side." After hearing him pray that prayer many times, someone asked him why he prayed that prayer so fervently. THE RED BALLOON by Father
William A. Beaver, OSB

I had been on retreat at St. Vincent Archabbey in Latrobe, Pennsylvania, given by a fine older monk from England. He was a wonderful storyteller. I had been scratching my head in order to preach about the Trinity the following weekend when the Retreat Master shared, much to my surprise, a challenging story regarding the Trinity.

The Retreat Master recalled riding on one of those fine English trains—called “carriages”—that made frequent stops. At one stop Father noticed a beautifully dressed family board the train: mother, father and twin sons. One son carried a red balloon; the other a blue balloon. At another stop, a father boarded holding his screaming daughter. Our Retreat Master noticed a red balloon bobbing up and down the aisle coming towards the upset child, the young boy holding to it tightly. When he came to the girl, he gave the red balloon to her and said, “Here, this is for you.”

The child took the balloon, stopped crying, and with much joy, showed her balloon to all the passengers on the train—no more tears, just glee & smiles. This was a pure act of love, especially poignant since Christmas was only a week away. This beautiful story struck me deeply, and as I reflected, I experienced this as a wonderful comparison of the Trinity: first, the episode centers on love, the centerpiece of the Trinity relationship between Father/Son/Holy Spirit. Here’s how I interpreted it: The twin boy represented the Father—who gave his precious son Jesus (the red balloon) to a hurting world, and this balloon gift then captured the world (the girl), which then spread cheer (the Holy Spirit).
