

Notes from our Pastor, Fr. Paul:

QUALITY OF LIFE: "Obstacles in the Way"

What do we do when we start out for a walk and find a shoelace has become untied? We stop and tie it, lest it trip us up and make us stumble. All of us, if we set out on our Lenten journey, intending to add greater quality to our way of living, are likely to find something that hinders us. It may be just lethargy. Science tells us that any body of matter that is at rest tends to remain at rest, unless it is acted upon by some external force. It takes some pushing on our part to make a difference. Once this is taken care of: though, there are still likely to be obstacles in the way. Some problems reflect the past. For example, if we find ourselves feeling angry or cross with little provocation, we may have to discover what causes it. Has someone hurt us and left us emotionally wounded? Or have we hurt someone else and feel cut off from them? If so, is there not a way in which we can be reconciled and then let the past be the past? For our own sake, as well as the sake of others, we need to get the obstacle of resentment out of the way. Peace can begin with you.

It may also be that we are hindered by failing to realize our own inherent worth and being unaware of our true potential. It is so easy, when we have failed at some endeavor, to feel that much of our life is a failure. Lenten time spent in prayer and meditation can help us to see ourselves as we really are, not only the bad but the good. God gives each of us gifts, potential that often goes unused, perhaps not some particular skill but the ability to be a person who makes others feel better. Perhaps, we need to remember that the God, who made us, took an earth that was dark, "without form and void," and changed it into our beautiful world. God's grace recreates us, forgives us, and sustains us. With God's help, obstacles can be overcome and our lives can find greater quality than we ever thought possible.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS is a popular devotion (also called the Way of the Cross) in honor of the Passion and death of Christ. It consists of meditating on 14 "stations" or "stages" in the Passion of Christ, such as His condemnation by Pilate, His scourging, His journey to Calvary, and the tomb. The stations are wooden crosses, often inserted in paintings or sculptures, and may be attached to the walls of a church or oratory or erected outdoors. The stations must be lawfully erected and blessed by one who has the authority to do so. (CCC2669) Stations of the Cross will be held this week on Friday, March 14th, at 12:10 p.m. at Visitation and at 7 p.m. at St. Pius X.

LENTEN GUIDELINES

Abstinence: Catholics in the U.S. age 14 and older are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. The Church law forbids use of meat, but does not prohibit eggs, milk products or condiments made with animal fat. Fasting: Catholics in the U.S., from the day after their 18th birthday until the day after their 59th birthday, are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Church law allows for only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit the taking of some food in the morning and evening. The combined quantity of the two meals should not exceed the quantity eaten at the full meal. The drinking of ordinary liquids does not break the fast. Note: Persons taking medication or with health concerns should follow their doctor's advice. Prayer/Almsgiving: Abstinence and fasting should lead Catholics to s deeper prayer life. Almsgiving provides an opportunity for a deeper understanding and response to the needs of the poor.

Lent also leads us to church more often for prayer. The Sacraments of Penance and Holy Eucharist should be especially close to us as they enable us to effect a change in ourselves. These Sacraments are building blocks, not only for our parishes, but for ourselves, as they sanctify our existence in this world. Take the opportunity to receive penance at least once during Lent, maybe at the beginning, and see if we can live a different life for the remainder of the 40 days. Make the journey to additional Masses to receive the Holy Eucharist other than at Sunday Mass, spend additional time before the Blessed Sacrament, which can only deepen the sense of faith, and spend time in journeying with Christ through the Stations of the Cross. Let us remember that Easter is our return every year to our own Baptism, and Lent is our preparation for that return-the slow and sustained effort to perform, at the end, our own passage into the new life of Christ.






