

Prayer to Mary Immaculate



Memorial Day is next Monday, May 26th. We will be celebrating Mass at one of our parish cemeteries on Memorial Day at 9:00 a.m. This year we will celebrate the Mass at St. Pius X Cemetery in Mt. Pleasant. This Mass is an excellent way to start the day, which is set aside to remember and pray for all the deceased, especially our veterans. You are reminded to bring lawn chairs if you wish to have a seat. There will be no 7 a.m. Mass at St. Pius X on Memorial Day, only the cemetery Mass.

Cemetery envelopes are included in your packets entitled "Cemetery Improvements." This offering enables us to maintain our parish cemeteries and increase our permanent perpetual care fund. We're planning to do some work in our cemeteries this year, along with the standard mowing & upkeep. Please help us preserve the resting places of all our family members who have died in Christ! PLEASE BE PATIENT! With the harsh winter and very wet spring, there's much work that needs taken care of at the cemeteries. *Please be patient* as we clean up the graves and get fresh grass planted. Please note that as we prepare your graves for Memorial Day, I ask that you take all containers, rubbish, plastic flower pots and water jugs (any items you brought from home) with you, or please discard them in the dumpster. **PLEASE DO NOT** leave garbage lying on the ground. I hope you can appreciate our policy, and I thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

PERPETUAL CARE We have an endowment fund for our cemeteries. This fund provides for ongoing maintenance and repairs at the cemeteries entrusted to our care. The perpetual care fee charged at the time of burial is \$300. If you wish to pay it pre-need, the fee is \$200. If you have any questions regarding any of the cemeteries, please call the parish office.

FISH FRY WRAP-UP The final numbers for our Lenten Fish Fry at St. Pius X are in. Thanks to everyone who made our 2025 fish fry possible: our workers, bakers, patrons, customers and those who donated supplies. Through your efforts, I thank you for these numbers: total income was \$44,352.00; expenses were \$13,078.37; thus, our profit realized is \$31,273.62.

ACCORDING TO CHURCH LAW Trinity Sunday, June 15, is the last Sunday that you can make your Easter duty. The confession of sin cleanses us. Christ in communion is our strength. Please do not deprive yourself of such gifts of healing, strength and love. Just for clarification, the precept of the Church is as follows: to lead a sacramental life; to receive the sacrament of Penance, regularly and Holy Communion frequently–minimally at least once a year, between the First Sunday of Lent and Trinity Sunday.

ARE YOU A REGISTERED PARISHIONER? If you are attending either one of our parishes and are not a registered parishioner, we would like to invite you to do so. Simply call the parish office & speak to Erin and we can get this done. You may also register if you are no longer a student and living with your parents or on your own. Do not assume that because your parents are registered that you are automatically registered as an adult. This is a necessity for being a *Godparent or Confirmation Sponsor*. You are not permitted to be either if you are not an active, registered and practicing Catholic.

SOME REFLECTIONS ON MARRIAGE

This is the time of year when a large number of weddings are celebrated by the Church. It's also a good time for us as members of God's family to review what we as Catholics understand marriage to be. We believe that marriage is more than a contract between a man and a woman. It is a covenant relationship of love and life for the baptized; an intimate partnership rooted in the covenant of irrevocable personal consent. At the wedding feast of Cana, Jesus celebrated the gift of love in marriage and helped the couple celebrate their consent of selves to each other. He thus blessed their togetherness for life. Jesus Christ, Himself, becomes the third partner in the Christian marriage. We, as Catholics, validly receive the Sacrament of Matrimony when we exchange our consent with our partner in the presence of a priest and two witnesses. Once the covenant bond has been made, the marriage cannot be broken. However, sometimes a Catholic marriage ends in divorce. If a Catholic couple gets a civil divorce they are not free to remarry. But the divorced couple can continue to receive the Sacraments as long as they don't attempt to remarry outside the Church and contradict the previous covenant. If the separated couple can give evidence to indicate that a covenant relationship doesn't exist, that for some reason there was not a free exchange of consent to the marriage, then an annulment procedure could begin.
