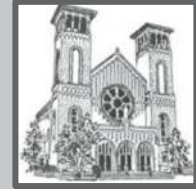

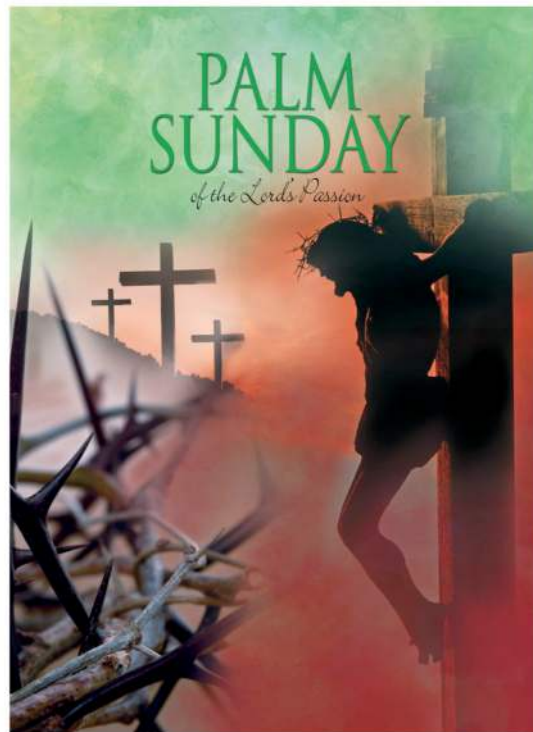

Notes From Our Pastor, Fr. Paul

QUALITY OF LIFE: "BRIGHTNESS AND HOPE" Does Palm Sunday fit in with the spirit of the Lenten season? Lent is generally seen as a penitential time, a period of serious consideration as to how we can remove the unproductive parts of our lives and replace them with something more worthy. Then, along comes Palm Sunday with a lot of parading, shouting and celebrating. Is this suitable? How does it fit? There are several answers to this, which are appropriate. One answer is that every season, in every time and in every mood, it is always in place to welcome Jesus into our lives and to celebrate his coming. God's presence enriches every time of life. It is also true that we should always enjoy and celebrate the "now." Today is part of our total life experience. Jesus came to give us abundant life, and part of that abundance is appreciation of what can be around us every day: beauty, friendship and meaningful work. When Jesus entered Jerusalem, he knew that not everyone would welcome him. In fact there were some who opposed his coming and resented his popularity. Some religious leaders told Jesus to stop his followers from celebrating, but Jesus answered, "I tell you that, if they keep quiet, the stones themselves will start shouting." Despite the opposition, Jesus chose to celebrate. Is this not a good lesson? Few of us can say that everything is perfect in our life situation. We have problems to face, probably short term and long term. There may be obstacles in our way or people who hinder us. Our success in life may be only partial, but God calls us to celebrate what we have. We should not wait until everything is perfect. If our skies contain a few clouds, be glad for the sun that shines around and through them. Feel the excitement of Jesus' coming. Enjoy Palm Sunday's brightness and hope.

PENANCE The last regional service is scheduled on **MONDAY, MARCH 30** at St. Florian (United), 6:30 p.m. No other confessions are scheduled during Holy Week.

GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION At Liturgies on Good Friday, a special collection will be taken for the upkeep of the Holy Land and to help impoverished people who inhabit this part of the world. You're asked to be generous to this particular cause. Also, we encourage your continued magnanimity to your parish at Easter.

OFFICE CLOSED Holy Thursday, April 2nd thru Easter Monday, April 6th. It will reopen on Tuesday, April 7th.

LENTEN GUIDELINES *Abstinence*: Catholics in the U.S. age 14 & older are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent & Good Friday. The church forbids use of meat, but doesn't prohibit eggs, milk products or condiments made with animal fat. ***Fasting*:** Catholics in the U.S. from the day after their 18th birthday until the day after their 59th birthday are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday. Church law allows for one full meal daily, but doesn't prohibit the taking of food in the morning & evening. The combined quantity of the two meals shouldn't exceed the quantity eaten at the full meal. The drinking of ordinary liquids doesn't break the fast. Note: Persons taking medication or with health concerns should follow their doctor's advice. ***Prayer/Almsgiving*:** Abstinence & fasting should lead Catholics to a deeper prayer life.

ON HOLY THURSDAY, April 17, it's a tradition to spend time with Jesus in the repository after the Mass of the Lord's Supper. This is also a time to make a pilgrimage not only to your own parish, but also to our neighboring parishes. The chapels holding the Altar of Repose at these parishes until midnight with night prayer at 11:45 p.m. are: Visitation in Mt. Pleasant, St. Joseph in Everson and St. Aloysius in Dunbar. The grotto at Visitation will be open for prayer on Good Friday, April 3, from 3- 9 p.m. and on Holy Saturday from noon until 6 p.m. Please use the entrance on the side of the church next to the school building. *Please note there are only steps that access the grotto.* You're welcome to spend some quiet time in prayer as Good Friday draws to a close.

TENEBRAE WILL BE presented on Wednesday, April 1, at 7 p.m. at St. Pius X. Tenebrae is derived from an ancient Holy Week service which reflects on Christ's passion, crucifixion and death through the reading of lessons, singing of hymns, and extinguishing of candles. A service will also be presented at St. Rita's in Connellsville on Good Friday at 8:30 p.m. All are welcome to attend.

GOOD FRIDAY, STATIONS of the Cross, will be held at Visitation at 12:15 p.m. An outdoor version will take place at St. Aloysius in Dunbar at 6 p.m. *Please be aware there is significant walking involved, both uphill & downhill, and there are no places to be seated along the route.*

BLESSING OF BASKETS at St. Pius X, 11 a.m. on Saturday, April 4th and at Visitation at 12:30 p.m.

ON THE SUNDAY after Easter, April 12, people all over the world will gather to celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy. From Sr. Faustina's diary, it's clear that this Octave Day of Easter is a day chosen by Christ as a day of extraordinary graces, a complete outpouring of His mercy upon all who approach Him with great trust and expectant faith. We'll be having the novena prayers beginning on Good Friday at Visitation at 6 p.m.

BLESSED PALMS WILL be distributed at all Masses this weekend. It's customary to take palm branches home and adorn crucifixes, holy pictures and family graves with them during this holy season.

ROSARY AT ST. PIUS X The rosary will be recited prior to the 10:30 a.m. Mass next Sunday, April 5th, starting at 9:45 a.m.

Since the **Easter Vigil** can start no earlier than 8:30 p.m., there will be no 4 or 6 p.m. Masses on Saturday, April 4. Instead, Mass will be at Visitation at 8:30 p.m.

The annual **Easter egg** hunt at St. Aloysius in Dunbar will be held on Saturday, April 4 at 1 p.m., for children through sixth grade. All children from the regional parishes are invited, rain or shine!



This week is the one week in Jesus' life which we can follow daily. It's a week in which we can walk along with Him in His footsteps. Holy Week can become a week of holiness for each of us. Our celebration during Holy Week offers us uncountable blessings. We can renew our lives, reconciling ourselves in confession. Above all, we can celebrate in the Triduum on the last days of Holy Week by sharing in the Lord's Supper on Thursday, by standing at the cross with Mary and John during three hours of agony on Friday, by welcoming the Risen Jesus into our lives at Saturday's Vigil of Resurrection. We can make the Gethsemane pilgrimage by visiting our neighboring parishes on Holy Thursday night to spend time in prayer with our Lord. We can follow the Stations of Our Lord's last hours on Friday afternoon and evening. We can begin our home celebration of Easter by having our food baskets blessed in His name on Saturday. All this we can do, as we welcome the Lord on Palm Sunday to the song of Hosanna. May we not abandon Him the rest of the week as the crowds did. May we walk with Christ through the liturgies of Holy Week. This is our prayer during the most sacred of weeks.

On Thursday at 10 a.m., Bishop Kulick will be the main celebrant of the Chrism Mass, joined by all the priests of the Diocese of Greensburg. The Bishop will consecrate the oils to be used in administering the Sacraments throughout the Diocese in the upcoming year. You, along with people throughout the diocese, are invited to attend that Mass. The Chrism Mass at the Cathedral is the only Mass offered in the Diocese on Holy Thursday morning.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, following the 7 p.m. Mass on Holy Thursday until midnight in the grotto at Visitation. Please plan to spend some time before the Blessed Sacrament. We'll close the evening with Night Prayer at 11:45 p.m.
