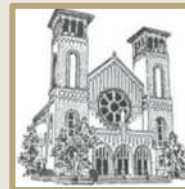

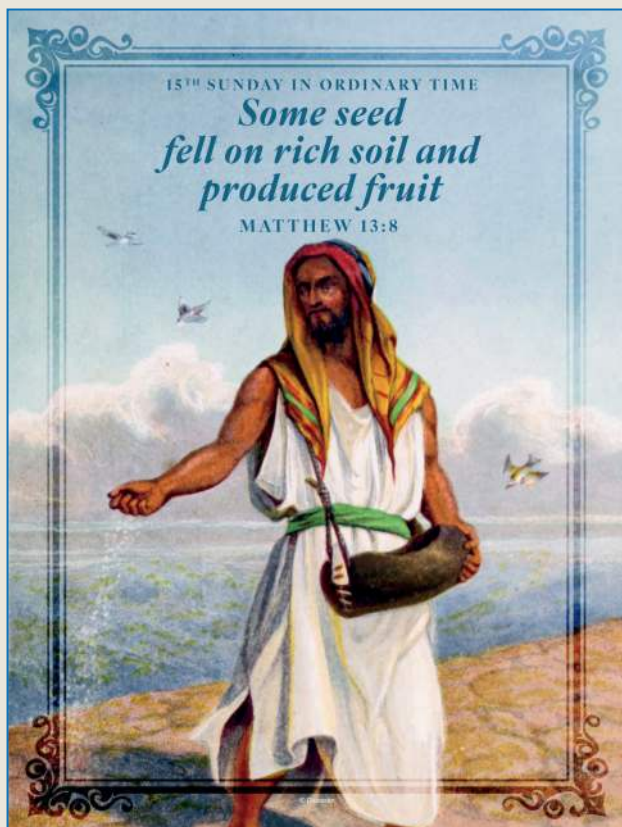

Notes From Our Pastor, Fr. Paul

THE SACRAMENTS: SIGNS OF DIVINE PROMISE The Good News of Jesus Christ is the news of life. The innermost fear of each of us is our own death. We dread the moment of apparent nothingness. No more me! Yet, we struggle to assure ourselves that "something" must be. We cannot just end. Jesus came to assure us that we shall not end; in fact, He proclaims that death has no dread, that death is the moment when we are really born to a life undreamed, a life fulfilled, a life that only God could imagine: this new life is God's own life with all that we can conceive as truly God—life, love, peace, togetherness with all those we love and desire to love. That is Good News! However, we still struggle with that News. And Jesus knows the struggle of each of us. To assure that death has no sting, He has conferred upon us sacramental moments, moments of promise that we live forever. The Sacraments act as stepping stones through life to keep us from falling into despair or sinking into dread. The Sacraments announce again and again that we have life, that nothing in life need overcome us, that we are good and lovable in God's eyes and our own. The Sacraments are the directional signs to the heavenly promise. They lead us to become whom we've always really desired to be. They show us that true humanness is to be of God: we are His family, no less than that. And His children are made for His Life forever. In the gift from Jesus of the Sacraments and in our reception of them we confidently seal the Promise: we are the Father's People, living a life that is forever. That is Good News!

THIS TUESDAY, JULY 14th, is the feast day of St. Kateri Tekakwitha. She was born in 1656, probably in New York, and died on April 17, 1680. Tekakwitha was the child of a Mohawk father and a Christianized Algonquin mother. At age four, she was the only member of her family to survive smallpox. Staying with her anti-Christian uncle, she was deeply impressed at age 11 by the lives and words of three visiting Jesuits, likely the first white Christians she had ever encountered. Harassed, stoned, and threatened with torture in her home village, Tekakwitha fled 200 miles to the mission of St. Francis Xavier at Sault Saint Louis (which had been established by French Jesuits in 1680), near Montreal. There she came to be known as the "Lily of the Mohawks" in recognition of her kindness, prayer, faith and heroic suffering. Accounts of Tekakwitha's life written by de Lamberville and fellow missionaries contributed significantly to the documentation necessary for her canonization, the cause for which opened in 1932. She was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1980. In December 2011, after evaluating the testimony of a young boy who claimed that his infection with flesh-eating bacteria disappeared after he prayed for her intercession, Pope Benedict XVI recognized Tekakwitha as a saint. She was canonized the following October.



THIS THURSDAY, JULY 16, is the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Mount Carmel was a holy place hundreds of years before Christ. There the prophet Elijah challenged the prophets of the pagan god Baal to a contest where the power of God was shown forth. Later, in the early centuries of Christianity, people who wanted to pray and grow close to God settled on the slopes of Mount Carmel. In time a monastery was built there. In the year 1251, the Prior General of the Carmelites, Simon Stock, had a vision of Mary the Mother of God. Today became the special feast day of the Carmelite Order. In the 18th century the feast was extended to the whole church. It is celebrated widely in Italy, where people parade through the streets and carry a statue of Mary. Italian Americans have kept up the custom.

OFFERTORY: FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- ◆ **Should I make my contribution by check or cash?** Either is fine and both are appreciated. Please note, using a check creates a safeguard for you & the parish: it's endorsed "for deposit only" and is traceable for tax purposes and in case of errors.
- ◆ **Do you want all my envelopes?** If you make your donation once a month or for multiple weeks, you only need to include one offertory envelope.
- ◆ **What should I do if I attend Mass at a different Church?** Hopefully, all churches return envelopes to the church of origin. If you have any concern, just wait until you return to your own church or mail it to the parish office.
- ◆ **I didn't receive my envelopes. What should I do?** Occasionally, some people don't receive their monthly packets of envelopes. Call the parish office at 724-547-1911 so that we may notify the envelope company. Then use a plain envelope, label it with your name, date, amount and envelope number, if you know it.
- ◆ **Does it matter whether or not I write the amount on my envelope?** Yes! Our money counters are parish volunteers. They verify that the amount in the envelope is the same as the amount listed on the envelope. Contributions are then posted on the computer, and this record-keeping procedure follows IRS and diocesan guidelines.
- ◆ **If I write a check for a second collection, to whom do I make a check payable?** Unless directed otherwise, all checks should be made out to your parish. The money taken in the second collection is deposited in the church account, and then a single check is sent to the diocese or St. Vincent de Paul Society.
- ◆ **Please avoid using tape, staples or glue!!!**

Reflections on Marriage

This is the time of year when a lot of weddings are celebrated by the Church. It's also a good time for us as members of God's family to review what we as Catholic Christians understand marriage to be. We believe that marriage is more than a contract between a man and a woman. It's a covenant relationship of love and life for the baptized; an intimate partnership rooted in the covenant of irrevocable personal consent. We, as Catholics, validly receive the Sacrament of Matrimony when we exchange our consent with our partner in the presence of a priest and two witnesses. Once the covenant bond has been made, the marriage cannot be broken. However, sometimes a Catholic marriage ends in divorce. If a Catholic couple gets a civil divorce, they aren't free to remarry. But that divorced couple can continue to receive the Sacraments for they are assumed to be solely separated for some reason. If the separated couple can give evidence to indicate that a covenant relationship doesn't exist, that for some reason there wasn't a free exchange of consent to the marriage, then an annulment procedure could begin. If you have any questions concerning the Sacrament of Matrimony, please feel free to contact one of our priests.
